

## **Clabuesch, James**

Early Saturday morning, Sept. 1, 2001, James Harley Clabuesch, beloved husband of 37 years, father, grandfather, and friend, passed away peacefully after a long illness, at home with his family. In his last days, he was also surrounded by many close friends.

Throughout his life, Jim touched the lives of many, not only family and friends who knew him personally, but in everything he did. Jim served in the United State Navy for three years. For 16 years he served both as secretary and trustee on the Laker School Board, and was a dedicated member of the Pigeon Lions Club for 26 years. Jim was an electrical contractor and owner of Jim's Electric for 22 years. He was well known for his great attitude toward life, his sense of humor, and his love for a good debate.
