If any bed bugs are detected you will be notified and treatments will be scheduled. Placement of these monitors can help identify bed bug problems early on before they become a major problem. 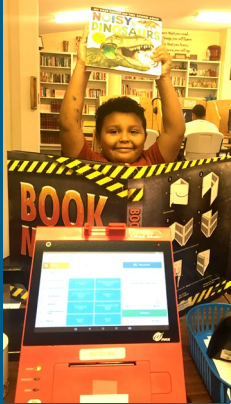

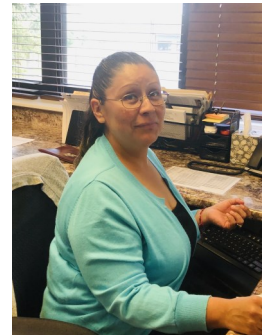


Please Welcome Dale Reed & Monica Rosales to MHA
