## "High Winds"

The high winds are blowing as I write this and I find myself thinking about those who live in places where the wind blows like this all the time. We call Chicago the Windy City, although, according to World Walks: Walking Holidays, it is not as windy as Dodge City. Funny that Cheyenne didn't even make the list of the Windiest Places On Earth, even though every time I've been there, I would have called it a contender.

Guinness Book of World Records and the National Geographic Atlas both give the award for the Windiest Place On Earth to Commonwealth Bay, Antarctica, where windspeed has regularly been recorded at over 150 mph. While people do live and work there temporarily for scientific purposes, there are no permanent human residents. No wonder. The temperature there rarely gets above freezing.

I am frequently thankful that I live in this beautiful part of our country. I am also thankful that sub-freezing temperatures are not the norm here. I couldn't live in Commonwealth Bay and am ever so thankful that I don't have to. I'm thankful for my home, thankful for its safety and comfort, thankful for the neighborhood in which I live, and the faith family God has given me. And as I feel my thanks, I hear the words of the Pharisee, "God, I thank you that I am not like other people..."

As part of my spiritual growth, I must ask: Where does my thanksgiving for shelter that protects me from the occasional high winds give way to pride that supplants humility? Is that what happened to the Pharisee? Did he start out simply being thankful for God's gifts and then gradually became someone who thought he was better than everyone else? How do we know if we are truly being thankful or if our thanks are tinged with pride that leads to self-aggrandizement?

How do we stay humble?

The Benedictines believe that there are twelve steps to humility: fear of God, self-denial, obedience, perseverance, repentance, serenity, self-abasement, prudence, silence, dignity, discretion, and reverence. Each step builds on the previous steps and, like the 12 steps in Alcoholics Anonymous, are not meant to be checked off and forgotten, but reviewed continuously throughout our lives.

Maybe your humility is intact and you don't need the twelve steps. But word to the wise: if you find yourself saying, "God, I thank you that I am not like other people: braggarts, showoffs, narcissists, or even like that loudmouth over there," you might not be as humble as you thought you were.

Let's work on our humility together and try very hard not to take pride in it!


