"Welcome to Coronado Athletic Club!"

MISSION STATEMENT

"Coronado Athletic Club is dedicated to the complete development of the student athlete. We will continue to emphasize education and sportsmanship as the foundation of our program. Winning in life is the ultimate achievement and the friendships born through athletic competition are the true rewards."

The competitive soccer program is intended to provide:

- Talented young athletes the opportunity to develop their athletic skills and sportsmanship-like attitudes in a more competitive atmosphere.
- A good feeling about yourself, self-confidence, and camaraderie with others.
- Understanding that "perfect practice makes perfect play".
- Realizing there is no "I" in team. The team concept is important not only in sports but will also prepare you for future endeavors with friends and professional life.
- Preparing to play middle/high school soccer and beyond.
- Creating an opportunity to compete on a state-wide and national level.
- Learning to respect yourself, your teammates, and your coaches, no matter what level of success you have on the field.

Soccer is a team sport. The soccer team system is set up to give the team a chance to learn how to win, to be safe, and to have fun. In order to meet these requirements, the following rules are enforced:

CODE OF CONDUCT

RULE #1

Be at every practice on time, ready to play. Do not leave early or make it a social gathering.

RULE #2

Players **WILL NOT** criticize other players (or themselves) on or off the field. This takes away from the team concept.

RULE #3

Players aged 11 and below are not allowed to be dropped at any training/game location without supervision.

RULE #4

Players will play positions assigned by the coach and will show appropriate respect at all times. Learning all positions within the team will greatly enhance skills and abilities.

RULE #5

Players are required to travel to out of town tournaments and league games at their own expense.

RULE #6

Players, parents and coaches must abide by the rules herein, and in addition, US Club Soccer (USCS), Arizona Soccer Association (ASA) and Pima County Junior Soccer League (PCJSL) Codes of Conduct.

RULE #7

Players/parents must whenever possible participate in fund-raising efforts to raise money for tournament entry fees or make a donation in an amount to be agreed upon between the coach, manager, and parents. (See separate tournament fee section)

RULE #8

Playing time will be determined by coaches. Every effort will be made by coaches to ensure each player gets playing time. There will be no minimum playing time and playing time may vary from game to game.

RULE #9

Being part of a Club offers opportunities for players to play up with older teams and/or lateral play to higher level teams. This privilege is earned and can be withdrawn at any time if the player has discipline or behavioral issues.

RULE #10

Bullying either during practice, games, or personal time will not be tolerated by CAC. CAC's Anti-Bullying Policy must be read and agreed to by all parents and players.

COACHES, PARENTS, PLAYERS, AND SPECTATORS

Coaches, parents, and spectators should set a high standard of behavior for the boys and girls including:

- Not using inappropriate language.
- No differences should be addressed in front of the team or at the field. Constructive criticism is encouraged. Complaints without proposed solutions are not!
- Treat referees with respect - without them we have no games.
- Maintain a respectful attitude toward all players, parents and coaches at all times.
- Coaches are responsible to correct poor play. Spectators are responsible for supporting good play with positive comments.
- Parents should attend all parent/team meetings whenever possible.

Players agree to:

- Make every effort to develop their own sporting ability, in terms of skill, technique, tactics, and stamina.
- Give maximum effort and strive for the best possible performance during a game, even if the team is in a position where the desired result has already been achieved.
- Set a positive example for others, particularly young players and supporters.
- Avoid all forms of gamesmanship.
- Always have regard to the best interests of the game, including where publicly expressing an opinion on the game and any particular aspect of it, including others involved in the game.
- Not use inappropriate language.
- Make every effort consistent with Fair Play and the Laws of the Game to help the team win.
- Know and abide by the Laws, rules and spirit of the game, and the competition rules.
- Accept success and failure, victory and defeat, equally.

- Resist any temptation to take banned substances or use banned techniques
- Treat opponents with due respect at all times, irrespective of the result of the game.
- Safeguard the physical fitness of opponents, avoid violence and rough play and help injured opponents.
- Accept the decision of the Referee without protest and show due respect.
- Avoid words or actions that may mislead a Referee.
- Abide by the instructions of their Coach and Team Officials, provided they do not contradict the spirit of this Code.
- Show due respect towards the Team Officials of the opposition.
- Show due respect to club board members, team managers, and volunteers
- A player should always show due respect to the interests of supporters

In addition, Coaches agree to:

- Establish a set of team rules and regulations and enforce them equitably throughout the season.
- Hold an initial parent/coach meeting, and remain approachable throughout the season to address any concerns.
- Distribute team rules/regulations.
- Review his/her plans, philosophy, and projected areas of concentration based on evaluations.
- Present plans for the season, such as tournaments, practice times and locations etc.

GENERAL CLUB RULES

1. LEAGUE AND TOURNAMENT PLAY

League games are played in Fall and Spring along with select tournaments decided upon between the Director of Coaching and Team Coaches. League games may be played in Sierra Vista, Tucson, or Phoenix. The decision to play league games is at the discretion of the Team Coach.

It is required that players and parents honor commitments made to teams and coaches. In order to be a successful competitive, travel soccer program, players and parents must understand that attendance at tournaments, league play, seasonal, regional and state playoffs are necessary for the team's success.

2. TOURNAMENT FEES AND TRAVEL COSTS

Parents or Players' Representatives will be liable for the costs incurred in attending tournaments including (but not limited to): entry fees, lodging expenses, meals, and travel costs such as mileage, tolls, and air fare. These costs are NOT included in the Player Registration or monthly training fees and will be subject to change for each tournament. Fundraising may be used to offset the cost of tournament fees and travel costs. Player's may opt out of fundraising efforts by notifying their team manager and/or coach and those that do so **MUST** pay a proportionate amount for each tournament based on tournament cost divided by players attending and will be determined by the team manager and/or coach!

No player should be prevented from traveling to a tournament due to cost and sponsorship requests will be dealt with on a case by case basis.

3. SEASONS

4. TRAINING SPACE

Training space will be provided by the Club.

5. VOLUNTEER HOURS

Parental involvement is a very important part of your commitment. Participation is required from parents and players in order to ensure the Coronado Athletic Club soccer programs will continue flourish and be productive.

6. REGISTRATION AND TRAINING FEES

These fees are only up to and including April. Some teams may continue to play/train into May and June. Those players are liable for the appropriate monthly training fees for May and June if the team is still active. Players on a U15-U19 Team that are not high school age and continue to train/play during the HS Season Break are liable for monthly dues for Nov, Dec, and Jan in the amount of \$60 per month.

Sibling Discount

Sibling Discount is only applicable if the annual fees are paid in full or on monthly dues only.

- Oldest Player - Pays Full
- 2nd Player - \$20 off the monthly dues (if using the monthly payment plan option) or \$150 off the one-time annual fee.
- 3rd, 4th etc Player - \$40 off the monthly dues (if using the monthly payment plan option) or \$200 off the one-time annual fee

Mid Season Registrations

Fees for players joining CAC after the initial registration period of 1 June to 31 July will be handled on a case by case basis and will be prorated accordingly.

7. UNIFORMS

Uniform includes 3 game jerseys, 2 pairs of shorts, and 2 pairs of socks for U11 and above and 2 game jerseys, 1 pair of shorts, and 1 pairs of socks for U10 and below.

8. JERSEY NUMBERS

Jersey numbers will be allocated by the club although number requests will be taken at the beginning of each season and accommodated if possible.

9. OPTIONAL UNIFORM ITEMS

Optional items such as fan gear, training jerseys, warm ups, and backpacks can be purchased anytime online at <https://theshoptucson.com/coronado/>

10. OTHER CLUB INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

- This is a competitive environment, there is **NO** guarantee of minimum playing time. Tournament teams are selected by CAC Coaching staff based on player performance. Not all players will be selected to travel to every tournament.
- There is a 24-hour "No Contact Rule" in place after games regarding contact with a coach, face to face, via e-mail, or phone for any conflict resolutions.
- Player names and images may be posted on the official CAC website and social media sites unless otherwise requested by the parent.
