Tips for early Spring

- Preventative maintenance. Start by servicing your lawn and garden equipment.
- Remove leaves, twigs, and any fallen branches.
- Clean landscape beds and rake your lawn. Be sure to rake lightly so you don't disturb the soil.
- Top dress landscape beds with new mulch
- Apply fertilizer and pre-emergent (crab grass preventative) to your lawn.
- Apply a pre-emergent for weeds to your landscape beds.
- Lay back and watch the beauty of Spring!

(Dethatching)



Rejuvenate Your Lawn & Landscape

Does your lawn struggle to recover from the harsh winter conditions? Are you tired of raking and picking up sticks?

If so, here is a list of Spring services we offer to bring your lawn back to life.

Dethatching- Thatch is that brownish layer of organic debris that sits between the soil and grass leaves. Having some thatch is good for your lawn and will help to retain moisture. But too much thatch will prevent air, nutrients, and moisture from reaching the roots of your grass.

Fertilizing- A spring lawn application of fertilizer will give your lawn the helping hand it needs to have a strong start each season. Fertilizer will help enrich the soil, boost growth, and increase your lawns nutrient intake.

Seeding- It is very common to have to repair some areas of your lawn after winter. Some lawns thin out due to the stress and others may only have a few bare spots. Slit seeding is our preferred method because it gives the seed deeper contact with the soil, ensures better growth, and helps to protect from the elements.

Rolling- Spring is a great time to roll your lawn due to the high saturation of the soil. Rolling will only help to level out minor bumps and uneven areas of the lawn. Larger uneven areas may need to be top dressed and seeded before rolling.

Spring Cleanup- is our service for removing all leaves and debris from your lawn and landscape.

Spring Pruning- if you have not done so (in the fall) already, spring is the time to cut back perennials and grasses. Our crews will remove and dispose of all debris during this service.
