The Florence Rural Fire District put a new tactical water tender into service.

This new water tender comes with advanced electronics for vehicle safety, carries 1800 gallons of water, and has a front mounted deck gun for fast fire attack. It is also equipped with front spray bars and is able to spray water while moving. It carries an assortment of hose lines and ladders for fire fighting use. This new water tender will be replacing an older water

tender which is over 25 years old, and will serve the Florence community for years to come. It will be stationed at station 2 on Hidden Valley Rd. North.
