Trick or Treat and 'Belsnickel'

ctober is the month of Boo! I scared you. In other words, it's when ghosts, goblins, and monsters of various varieties roam our streets and bang on doors begging for candy. Imagine if instead of saying trick-or-treat, kids rang doorbells and shouted, Belsnickel! Belsnickel was an old German-American tradition in which children dressed in costumes and visited neighbors at Christmas, not Halloween. If neighbors couldn't guess who was behind each mask, the penalty was paid with sweet treats. Well, that sounds mighty familiar, don't you think?

And speaking of treats PSLs, Pumpkin Spice Lattes, have arrived as they do every year at this time. They were first named Fall Harvest Lattes, but their creator, Peter Dukes, switched the name to the company code PSL; the initials baristas were writing on customer cups. Since we're not all fans of PSLs, how do you feel about pumpkin seeds, a so-called superfood? One recipe recommends after you're done with your pumpkin, soak its seeds to remove pulp; add spices, then roast the seeds on a cookie sheet on top oven rack for 15/20 minutes at 350 degrees. The American Heart Association claims these babies contain 5.2 grams fiber/serving as opposed to those from shelled, storebought ones. A quarter cup of these seeds provides 42% of recommended daily magnesium intake to stay heart



and bone healthy, lower blood pressure, and prevent migraines; not bad for a tiny tasty seed.

One last thing about this month of October is that its last day is referred to as All Hallow's Eve, an offshoot of the ancient festival of Samhain. This pagan religious celebration honored the summer harvest when people would light bonfires while wearing

costumes to ward off ghosts. Truth be told, if you believe in ghosts, you are not alone. One poll revealed that four out of 10 Americans do believe in ghosts, demons, and other supernatural entities. Not to worry though. All you need do to ward off evil spirits is to ring bells loudly on October 31st. Easy-peasy. Gaming News

Illegal online gambling dwarfs legal

The market intelligence firm Yield Sec issued a summary of legal and illegal online gambling in the U.S. and reported that in 2024, "unlicensed offshore gambling platforms accounted for a staggering 74 percent of the United States' total online gross gambling revenue of \$90.1 billion. That means nearly three-quarters of all online gambling dollars are flowing through illegal channels." Out of the total \$90 billion, \$67.1 billion in revenue went to illegal operators and \$23 billion to legal. Yield Sec also lists 917 illegal platforms, compared to 95 licensed, with 668 affiliate sites, compared to just over 100 legal affiliates. And the illegal sector grew by nearly 65% in 2024 compared to 26% growth for the legal. The report concludes, "Most betting

now happens on mobile devices and new features like live dealer games are catching on quickly. Younger tech-savvy players are looking for fast easy access and exciting new experiences"

New Ocean's movie

Hollywood scuttlebutt has it that another in the Ocean's franchise of movies is in the works. Apparently, it's a prequel to the current crop of Las Vegas heist flicks, but that's about all that's known, other than filmmaker Lee Isaac Chung was at press time "in talks" to direct. Chung was an Academy Award nominee for his 2020 film Minari—about a Korean American family that moves to a tiny Arkansas farm in search of their own American dream.

Bingo and poker capital

After being named the bingo capital of the U.S., Montana has added

poker king to its gambling-related resume. Following up on the bingo study, gambling.com applied a similar analysis to poker and cited Montana's 2.11 poker rooms per 100,000 residents as tops in the country. Nevada was second at 1.13. Texas has the most poker rooms with 84 but finished ninth in the per-capita ranking. California with 60 poker rooms was 15th on the list. One thing is certain: They like to gamble in Montana.

Record year so far

For the first half of 2025, gross gaming revenue (GGR) in the U.S. from commercial casinos added up to \$38.4 billion, up from \$35.7 billion in the first six months of 2024. Sports GGR year to date was \$7.1 billion and igaming \$4.7 billion; combined, remote gambling accounted for a full 30% of the total. This year is on track to set a record for GGR.
















DEAR PAWS: As a seasoned traveler with hunting dogs, as well as puppies and family pets, going crossstate and cross-country, I find that you left out a few crucial items in your travel list important for dog safety/health when traveling.

First, an IIHS/NHTSA approved crate(s) for the dog(s) or, at minimum, safety belt harness(es) that will restrain the dog(s) in the event of a crash. Small dogs sitting on laps are not "restrained."

Second, a basic animal first aid kit in case of emergency due to a cut, bite, ingestion of something, etc., before one can get to emergency vet care on

Third, water. It's always best to bring at least a couple quarts of water from home to have handy for rest areas or pull-offs with no services like running water.

Thank you for considering my input on this topic.— Betsy M., via email

DEAR BETSY: Absolutely essential items! Thank you for adding to the list. A separate first aid kit for pets, included in their bag of supplies so that it's easy to find, is important. And using an Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) or National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHT-SA) approved crate has been shown to reduce or prevent pet injuries in the event of a crash. For dogs in the back seat, rather than a crate, a pet safety belt and harness is a much safer option than a collar and leash, or worse, just letting your pet sit unbelted.



The Dole Act

Have you wondered what exactly is included in the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act? There's one way to find out: Scroll through it. There's more to the Act than you might imagine, and all of it is to benefit you.

Sec. 301 calls for burial benefits for veterans who were under hospice care at the time of their death. It concerns those veterans who pass away between July 1, 2025, and Oct. 1, 2026 and who are receiving VA medical or nursing care before receiving hospice care—they will now receive full VA burial allowance. To read more, see www.va.gov/burials-memorials. Should you also wish to apply for pre-need eligibility to make it easier for family when the time comes, there is info on that page as well.

Sec. 143 addresses the reimbursement of ambulance cost for veterans in rural areas. This might be by ambulance or air ambulance, to the nearest hospital that can meet the needs of the veteran. Be sure of the details on this one if you might use this service. Read the definitions in the text because coverage varies by disability rating, distance to hospital and so on. This benefit is likely to change after Sep-

Zucchini bread

Dear Annie.

I love to bake. I have been asked for zucchini bread. Do you have a recipe that you would be willing to share with someone who loves bake? — Jacqui from Todd, NC

Dear Jacqui,

I have a friend, Marion, who has a friend named Shirley. Shirley makes a wonderful zucchini bread. I asked Marion if it would be alright to share this ideal recipe for zucchini bread. I am absolutely positive you will love it. —**Annie**

ZUCCHINI BREAD

3 cups self-rising flour

2 teaspoons cinnamon

3/4 cup pecans

2 cups sugar

½ cup vegetable oil

2 teaspoons vanilla

3 eggs (beat well)

1 18-oz. can crushed pineapple—save liquid

2 cups shredded fresh zucchini

½ cup sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

Non-stick vegetable oil coating

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, combine the flour, 2 teaspoons cinnamon, pecans and 2 cups sugar. In a large separate bowl, combine the oil, vanilla and eggs. Beat the egg mixture until creamy. Add the pineapple (with the liquid from the can). Add the dry ingredients to the liquid mixture and stir until mixed well. Add the shredded zucchini, stir until blended. Combine the additional sugar and cinnamon and pour 1/2 of it into 2-9-inch by 5-inch by 13-inch pans that have been sprayed with a non-stick vegetable oil coating. Pour the zucchini mixture into each pan (dividing evenly). Sprinkle the remaining cinnamon sugar on top of each pan. Bake for one hour.



Advil: How much is too much

Dear Savvy Senior,

I take Advil pretty regularly for arthritis pain and headaches, but how can I tell if I'm taking more than is safe? —Achy Alan

Dear Achy A.,

Ibuprofen-better known by one of its brand names, Advil, is one of the most popular medications on the market today for treating all different types of pain, headaches, fevers and cramps.

Given the drug's broad pain-reducing effects, safety record and availability over the counter (OTC), it's no surprise that some people pop the little brownish-red tablets whenever they feel the slightest twinge of discomfort.

But ibuprofen, which is also sold under brand names like Motrin and Nuprin, can pose certain health risks, especially for those with kidney or stomach issues. Here's what you should know.

What's Safe?

For most adults and children ages 12 years and older, the recommended OTC dose of ibuprofen is one (or two, if needed) 200-milligram tablets, caplets or gel caplets every four to six hours while symptoms persist. You

shouldn't take more than 1,200 mg (or six pills) in a 24-hour period.

If you haven't consulted a doctor about how much is safe, or if you aren't certain about your risk factors, it's best not to exceed the recommended limit of 1,200 milligrams a day.

If you have chronic pain, or were recently injured or had surgery, your doctor may prescribe ibuprofen for you at a higher dose. Prescription tablets are usually stronger compared to the OTC dose, such as 600 mg and 800 mg. The maximum daily dose for prescription-strength ibuprofen is 3,200 mg in a 24-hour period. But it's important only to take what your provider has prescribed for you.

Also be aware that ibuprofen is sometimes added to certain cold and flu medications, so always read the ingredient list on medications before using them.

Be Cautious

Ibuprofen belongs to a class of drugs known as nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, or NSAIDs, which reduce pain and inflammation by blocking the activity of certain enzymes.

But these enzymes also help maintain kidney and liver function and regulate the balance of fluids and electrolytes in your body. So, taking ibuprofen can be dangerous for patients with kidney disease or failure; those with liver damage or cirrhosis; and people with conditions that put strain on their kidneys, like high blood pressure or heart failure. Those at high risk for these conditions-as well as for stomach ulcers, heart attacks, strokes or bleeding problems-should talk with their doctors before taking ibuprofen.

People who take medications such as diuretics, anticoagulants, ACE inhibitors or ARBs (angiotensin receptor blockers) to manage cardiovascular issues should also be careful, because ibuprofen stresses the kidneys and the

To reduce these health risks, don't take the maximum recommended dose for more than a week or two at a time. If you are needing it for more than two weeks, or you're turning to ibuprofen every day to keep your aches and pains in check, you need to see your doctor.

When taken for long periods, ibuprofen can also increase the risk of stomach ulcers. The drug inhibits enzymes that, among other things, aid in

the production of mucus that lines and protects the stomach lining, so without these enzymes, the stomach becomes vulnerable to irritation and damage.

Alternatives

Some alternatives to ibuprofen you should talk to your doctor about include acetaminophen (Tylenol), topical NSAIDs (diclofenac gel) that is not absorbed into the blood to the same extent as oral NSAIDs, nonacetylated salicylates, curcumin (an active ingredient in turmeric) and acupuncture.





The Flying Dutchman

In poker, a cooler is the term used to describe a situation in which a player has a very strong hand, but loses to an even stronger hand held by an opponent. This usually happens in a situation where the strength of both hands would, in most cases, be unbeatable or very strong, and therefore it's almost impossible to fold. Let's look at an example.

The 2025 World Series of Poker (WSOP) at the Horseshoe & Paris Casinos in Las Vegas was comprised of 100 live events. One of them was the popular Event #64: \$1,000 Super Seniors, which required players to be at least 60 years old to play.

That tournament attracted 3,338 entrants and awarded \$2,937,440 in prize money. On Day 2, PokerNews was on-site and captured a big hand involving Marcel Luske, who poker fans might know as "The Flying Dutchman" from his early appearances of the WSOP on ESPN.

It was Level 19 (6,000/12,000/12,000) when Luske, known for humming and singing at the poker table, raised to 23,000 from middle position and fellow poker pro Kenna James called. Serge Didisheim then moved all in for 172,000 from the

big blind and Luske jammed over the top for 832,000 total. James thought long and hard about what to do and eventually called off his stack.

It was a huge cooler as the trio each held one of the three best hands in poker. According to a poker odds calculator, Luske was a 66.74% favorite to win the hand, though that dropped to just 8.97% when the flop came down QsJsJh to give James a come-from-behind full house.

The 5c turn cut Luske's & Didisheim's chances to just 4.76% each, with the former needed an ace and the latter a king.

Well, Lady Luck smiled on Luske as the As spiked on the river to give him aces full of jacks, which beat the queens full of James. Stacks were checked, and Luske barely had James covered with just 30,000 more.

Didisheim finished the tournament in 173rd place for \$2,659, while James took 172nd for the same amount of money. Meanwhile, that hand helped propel Luske to a deep run in the tournament, ultimately finishing in 10th place for \$28,244.

The concept of a cooler is significant in poker as it highlights the element of luck involved in the game. Even with a very strong hand, a player can still lose to a stronger one. It's a reminder that poker is not just about skill but also involves a degree of chance.

The Beef Case at Fontainebleau's Papi Steak costs \$1,000 but feeds only two; it's a 3.5-pound tomahawk that's served in a custom diamond-studded suitcase. For \$999.90, you can also get a 48-ounce

Japanese purebred Freedom Wagvu tomahawk at Four Sixes Ranch Steakhouse at the Wynn. The Vaca Vieja (Old Cow) at Bazaar Meat by José Andrés is a bone-in steak (of various cuts) from eight- to ten-year-old more flavorful cows grown on certified-organic non-GMO ranches in northern California; they cost \$90 per ounce, so an eight-ouncer runs \$720 (you can order a two-bite sample for \$64). Finally, the Taste of Japan at Resort World's Carversteak offers a selection of Japanese A5 wagyu for \$300 for a four-ounce minimum, plus \$75 per additional ounce, so eight ounces are a mere \$600-a Las Vegas bargain!

Universal Horror VIP Experience

Universal Horror Unleashed opened recently at Area15 with ticket prices starting at \$69; depending on date and time, they rise to \$99 and includes one entry to all four houses. An unlimited-access day pass ranges from \$99 to \$149.
