

Good morning!

A clip today that most likely will generate lots of good discussion...especially if we were using it at a meeting. Take a look [here](#).

The official called a push on blue 4 for pushing through the screen. Did he? I say yes. Was the screen illegal first? I say yes also. Does white give blue 4 *time and distance* to stop or avoid contact? I say no, so an illegal screen on white.

This probably would generate a 50/50 in a meeting as to what call to make. My opinion is that if we call illegal screens when they occur, it cleans our game up.

COULD we have an illegal screen AND a push through foul? If the illegal screen is called first, we then need to ignore any further contact unless it is flagrant or intentional. Could this be a double foul? Ugh, that really opens a can of worms. Regardless of what you call, you have to be able to explain to EACH coach why you called what you called.

Tuesday extra: The R should remind the official sooner to 'look at us when we report a foul' and if he/she does not, WAIT until you have eye contact! This is important and helps avoid table issues later!
