RCIA News!

The Rite of Election will be celebrated this Sunday, February 21st at the 11:30 a.m. with Fr. Andrzej presiding. It will be LIVE Steamed on the Saint Olaf Facebook Page - SaintOlafUt. Normally, this Rite is celebrated at the Cathedral of the Madeleine with the Bishop as the presider, but due to the pandemic it will be celebrated at each parish in the Diocese.

This rite affirms the catechumens' readiness for the sacraments of initiation. They will write their name in the Book of Elect, expressing their desire and intent to celebrate Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at Easter. They are called "the elect" from this point, indicating they have been chosen, elected, by God and the Church. This is the 2nd major step in the RCIA process.

Faith Formation

February 21 we will be resuming regular classes and starting our Lent "Center of Hope" food collection drive. Each Sunday through to March 28 we will be collecting non-perishable food items in a box on the front steps of the school during class times. Items of great need are Flour, Sugar, Vegetable oil, Dried potatoes, boxed meals like Hamburger Helper and Ramen. Thank you!
