- 1. UGRR State Marker/O'Dells Mill**
M-60 & Milo Barnes Park, Vandalia

- 2. Henry and Martha Shepard Homesite**
Camplite & S. Bogue St.
Kentucky Raid site



- 3. Birch Lake Cemetery/ Meeting House**
James Rd. north of Brownsville Rd.
1830's Meeting of anti-slavery Quakers



- 4. Chain Lake Baptist Church and Cemetery**
Chain Lake St. east of Carver Rd.
Organized 1848 by pioneer black families



- 5. Mt Zion Methodist Church and Cemetery**
Mt. Zion Rd. and Kessington St.
Organized 1849 by pioneer black families



- 6. Bethel AME Church and Cemetery**
Mt. Zion Rd. just west of Calvin Center Rd.
Organized 1856 by pioneer black families



- 7. Brownsville School #1**
20447 Osborn St.
1840's integrated one-room school,
closed 1957



- 8. Ramptown (site marker) Sec. 33**
Calvin Center Rd. south of M-60
Community of free blacks and freedom seekers



- 9. Bonine House**
M-60 and Penn Rd.
Home of UGRR stationmasters
James E. and Sarah Bogue Bonine



- 10. Bonine Carriage House**
M-60 and Calvin Center Rd.
Freedom seekers were sheltered here



- 11. Charles Osborn Home 1842-184**
M-60 and Calvin Center Rd.
co-founder Youngs Prairie
Anti-Slavery Meeting



- 12. Prairie Grove Cemetery**
Penn Rd. north of Fox St.,
Site of 1845 Quaker Meeting House
Forerunner of Penn Friends Meeting



- 13. Isaac Bonine Homestead "Cedarlee"**
Penn Rd. south of railroad tracks
1838 home of Isaac and
Sarah Talbot Bonine



- 14. Penn Friends Church**
Penn Rd. and Quaker St.
Site of original Penn Friends
Meeting 1880



- 15. Young's Prairie Cemetery**
Quaker St. and Decatur Rd.
Quaker Cemetery established
c. 1800.



- 16. William Jones Home**
M-60 and Gards Prairie Rd.
UGRR stationmaster and
Kentucky Raid site



- 17. Stephen Bogue Home**
M-60 and Crooked Creek Rd.
Stephen and Hannah
Bogue were stationmasters
on the UGRR.
