As We Gather: In Life and Death, Christ Fulfills the Law of God

The Pharisees ask a Law question. Jesus asks a Gospel question. The Pharisees seek to test Jesus in His own words. Jesus seeks to "test" them in the saving reality of who He is as the Messiah (Matt. 22:34–46). The Law requires you to "fear the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul" and to "love the sojouner" (Deut. 10:12–21). Failure to keep the Law perfectly brings judgment. On the other hand, the Gospel brings the grace of God given by Jesus Christ, that you may be blameless in the day of His return (1 Cor. 1:1–9). Jesus is David's Son yet David's Lord, true God and true man. He is Love incarnate who fulfilled all the demands of God's Law on our behalf, that we might be saved from the Law's condemnation and sanctified in the Gospel's forgiveness. Thereby we see that "God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord" (1 Cor. 1:9).

As the Cross, a symbol of our redemption, enters the sanctuary, God's people stand and fix our eyes upon it.

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

Sunday School: This week, we study "The Gentile Cause." A disagreement arises in the Church concerning the Gentile believers. Some want to make the Gentiles follow the Jewish laws. Peter, Paul, and Barnabas give testimony to the Jerusalem Council concerning their work among the Gentiles. The Council sends a letter to the Gentile believers, encouraging them and welcoming them as God's chosen people.

Stewardship: 1 Corinthians 1:4 – "I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus." The grace of God and thanksgiving go together. God has given us everything we possess and everything that we are. He is the Giver. Once we realize this, then thankfulness wells up inside of us. How could it not? And as Paul shows us here, it's not only the grace given to us individually that causes us to give thanks. It's even the grace given to others. We certainly have much to be thankful for when we look at the gifts of grace all around us. And how do we say thank you to the Lord? In any number of ways — in prayer, in sacrificial giving to His mission and in imitating His love and kindness to those around us.

Starting October 26 and running through November 8, we are starting a new practice. As we near All Saint's Day, we want to remember our loved ones who have died in the faith in the past two years. In future years, the practice will only include those between celebration of All Saint's Day. For this first time, we will be including those from 2024 and 2025. For the Sundays of October 26, November 2, and November 9 we will be displaying the obituary pictures along with the announcements on the TV in the entryway. We will also have copies of the obituaries for anyone that would like to read them again. We wanted to make sure that the congregation had this information ahead of time, so that one can prepare a bit for the emotional shock this may cause some of our members. *Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints.* (Psalm 116:15)
