PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Welcome to the Dayton Darting Association's 1985-86 season.

It has been related to me that some of our players need an explanation as to raising the dues to \$20.00 this season. You'll find the Anticipated Budget in this issue of our newsletter. This budget was approved by the Board of Directors at our June meeting. Please take a few minutes to examine the statement as I believe it to be self-explanatory.

The dues this year figure to be 74 cents per member per evening of play. I cannot think of another sport with such low weekly dues.

Last year the league dues were \$10.00, but you also paid \$5.00 for the Divisional Singles Championships, \$10.00 for the League Singles Championship, a minimum of \$1.00 to try out for the Quad City All Star Team and \$6.00 for our yearly banquet. This figures to be \$32.00 if you chose to participate in these events. The divisional and league championships will be open to all appropriate members at no additional fees. The All-Star Selection Committee is working on another method of choosing our Quad City Challenge Team which will also be cost free to you. I have issued a challenge to our North Dayton members to have a North-South All Star series which will be at no charge to you. Also, \$1,500 has been allocated for our banquet. If it is possible we are going to try to cover the cost of the banquet this year.

Already we have a phone number for the DDA and have purchased a file cabinet to better organize our

league. We need to obtain a computer system in the future as well as other items to help in organizing our association.

So as you can see the \$20.00 dues charged this year are justified as far as I am concerned. I believe this year may be one of the best in the DDA's history and the fees needed to be brought up to offer a quality association.

If any member needs further explanation to increasing the dues this year please feel free to contact me or come to our Board meetings as this is the last time I want to address this issue.

There will be various raffles run by the DDA throughout the year to help defray costs of events.

On a closing note, it has also been brought to my attention that a vicious rumor is being circulated throughout the DDA. The fees were not raised to cover losses from last year! If you read the budget please note the \$1600 carry-over from 1984-85. A portion of this is Summer League money but approximately \$900 was carried to 1985-86 with ALL bills paid up to date!

TROPHYS for the summer session will be available sometime near the middle of October. Team captains will be notified when they become available.

The summer TROPHYS are as follows:

DIVISION I

FIRST PLACE- HANKS BULLS won both the first and second rounds. Of a possible 378 points at the outset of the summer, the BULLS were able to claim 270 wins with 108 losses for a 71% average. The team is captain MIKE MANTIA, co-captain GENE CRAMER, CHRIS SANDERS, STEVE CHANNELL, and MARK GRECAVAGE.

SECOND PLACE-BRUNS OUTLAWS placed second in round one, and went on to win the play-off 15-12 against Hanks Cranks who finished second in

round two. BRUNS OUTLAWS won 243 and lost 117 of the 378 points available at the beginning of the season for an average of 64%. The OUTLAWS are captain ELMER STEINER, co-captain GLEN COX, STEVE ARDEN, and ALAN RHODES.

THIRD PLACE-HANKS CRANKS actually had a higher percentage of wins than the Outlaws, but because of the two round / play-off system, placed out of the awards. The CRANKS claimed 249, gave up 111 of the 378 points of the division for an average of 66%. HANKS CRANKS are captain GARY LYKINS, co-captain DENNIS HAWS, GERI MILLER, and JIM DAVIS.

DIVISION II

FIRST PLACE-DART TRAIN won both the first and second rounds. The total summer record for the DART TRAIN is an amazing 303 wins out of 348 points with only 45 losses for an average of blistering 87%. The team is captain PAUL COOPER, co-captain DAVE FUNDIS, FRANK MOLISH, J.J. JACKSON and RON YOUNG.

SECOND PLACE-CHEERS came in second both rounds. Thier record stands at 248 wins, 100 losses for an average of 71%. The team is captain GARY ZAHN, co-captain RON BRINSON, CHARLIE BEACH, and PATTY VIERS.

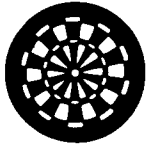
DIVISION III

FIRST PLACE- PENETRATORS won both the first and second rounds. Of 378 points, the PENETRATORS snatched 249 wins with 129 losses for a 66% share of the meat. The team is captain TED BORGERT, co-captain GARY FOLEY, JERRY TANSKY, MARK NEEDLES, and ERIC JOHNSON.

SECOND PLACE-CACTUS JOHNS DRUNKS finished second the first round but were way off pace with a 7th place finish the second round. Narrowly defeating Hanks Joints 14-13 in the play-offs, let the DRUNKS slide into the second place trophy. The

DRUNKS are captain KIETH DAVIS, co-captain CHUCK SHADE, TODD TUIITE, STEVE CLOSE, and TED ELLIS. They finished the summer batting 51% with 193 wins, 185 losses out of 378 available points.

THIRD PLACE-HANKS JOINTS were second in the last half of the summer session but lost by one point in the play-off to see thier hopes of a trophy go up in smoke. There was a protest registered by the JOINTS regarding the playing of illegal players by the Drunks, but the DDA board members voted to let the match stand as played. The JOINTS had a better average than the Drunks but lost second in the play-off. The JOINTS had a 56% victory rate claiming 210 wins and 159 losses out of 378 points. The JOINTS are captain BILL O'BRIEN, co-captain MARK SIMMONS, KIM DRAUGHN, DAN KRUZER, and TIM LUEHERS.

TONY PAYNE of Cincinnati was chosen as a member of the U.S. WORLD CUP TEAM to represent AMERICA in the WORLD CUP tournament in Brisbane, Australia scheduled for mid October.

The WORLD CUP is held every two years and is open to every country. This year there may be more than 15 nations participating.

The team that collects the most points during the tourney will hold the silver cup in thier country until it is won by another.

The first WORLD CUP was held in Wales in 1977. The winners since the outset are:

- 1st-WALES 110 pts.
- 2nd-ENGLAND 75 pts.
- 3rd-Rep IRELAND 30 pts.

1979

- 1st-ENGLAND 75 pts.
- 2nd-AMERICA 62 pts.
- 3rd-WALES 49 pts.

1981

- 1st-ENGLAND 132 pts.
- 2nd-SCOTLAND 45 pts.
- 3rd-NEW ZEALAND 41 pts.

1983

- 1st-ENGLAND 188 pts.
- 2nd-SCOTLAND 92 pts.
- 3rd-WALES 55 pts.
- 4th- AMERICA 37 pts.

In addition to playing for the cup, people will be playing for individual gold, silver, and bronze medals.

The team representing AMERICA the BEAUTIFUL will be captains GLENN REMICK and HOWIE REED, TONY PAYNE(OH), JOHN CRAMER(CA), DANNY VALLETTO(PA), RICK NEY(PA), SANDY REITAN(CA), and KATY CASILLAS(CA).

Tournament Travel Tips
by Linda Lou Busch

Interested in going to a big dart tournament? Think you can win some of the big money available? Sure you can! Here are some tips for tournament travelers - new and not-so-new.

Choosing the tournament:

1. Obtain an ADDO calendar and check the dates of the tournaments you are interested in.
2. Check the dates out at work to make sure you can get the time off; in case you need to take off early on Friday to make LOTD or wish to take Monday off to recuperate (a wise idea in many cases).
3. Making reservations early is a must! A month is usually enough time. If you pay by check for the first night or guarantee it with a credit card your room will be held in case you arrive after 6:00 pm.
4. Some tournaments are close enough to commute to, but if you plan to do so remember not to party

too hardy. The price of a hotel room is not much especially when you compare it with the cost of a D.W.I.

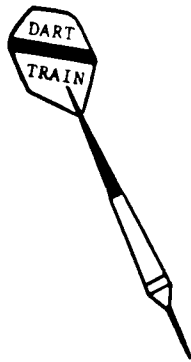
5. Sharing a room is another consideration. Pick someone reliable and compatible. Don't overfill your room. More than 4 or 5 people make a great party but that's a lot of people to shower and get ready for the first event of the day. Too many to get ready means you have to get up that much earlier.

6. Some tournament room rates are better than others. This may determine your choice of tournaments.

1. Plan enough in advance so that you can save up plenty of cash.
2. Figure your expenses so you aren't short of money in case of

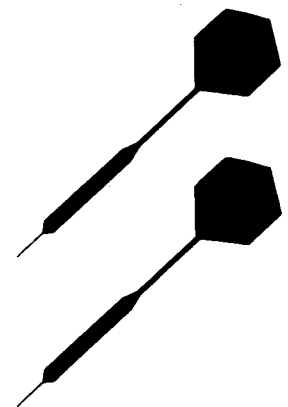

emergency. The hotel rates and entry fees are listed on the flyers, which can be found at other tournaments, dart stores or at local dart bars. Also the number to call for reservations will be on the flyers.

3. Meals cost a bundle at hotels and there is not always a McDonalds nearby. One way to cut expenses and still be able to eat is to pack a cooler with food and beverages. Be careful when taking your own drink into the dart hall as you can be thrown out of the hall and you will forfeit the entry fees you have already paid if you are caught.

4. Keep your copy of your entry form - in case your entry is omitted and to collect your prize money.

5. Take a good amount of dart supplies to insure you have the type of flights and shafts you prefer to shoot with. Supplies may cost you more at a tournament than at your local supplier.

6. Above all take all your valuables with you when you leave your hotel room. This includes ID, credit cards, cash, jewelry and cameras.

Another wise tip. Don't set your darts down at a tournament. If you must leave your darts give them to a friend to hold. Darts are valuable and easy to rip off if you are a trusting soul.

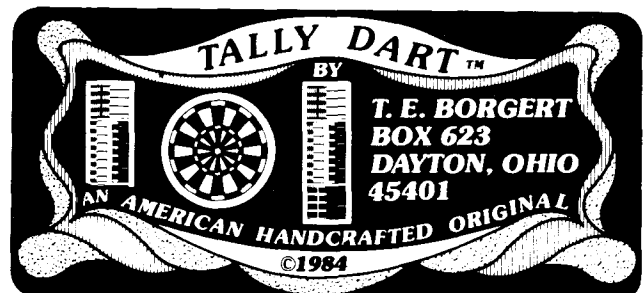
