Bonnie and Keely did a lovely presentation on smaller,
little know companies. Belmont Tumbler Co. of OH
actually went under during the depression produced Rose
Cameo (green cereal bowl and 5” plate). Dell Glass in NJ
had Tulip design 1930-1940 (green ice tub, green violin
vase, blue small violin). Liberty works (green candle
holders and small pitchers). Vineland Flint Glass Works
had stretch glass (yellow plate). Lorni glass Pitch and
KoppGlass Co. Basket Weave item. Diamond Glassware in
PA did stretch glass in 1920s, Luster glass, Crackle Glass
closed by fire in 1931.
