## **DEPUTY RECEIVES COMMENDATION**

(Madison, MS) During Madison County's Law Enforcement Appreciation Week, the Central Mississippi Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution honored Madison County Deputy Sheriff Jason Murphy Haven with the Law Enforcement Commendation Medal for his outstanding service to the City of Ridgeland Police Department and the Madison County Sheriff's Office.
