

Electrification Project Launched in Zaire

The Minister of Energy and Water, João Baptista Borges, presided last Friday, 28, in Kuimba, to launch the Electrification Project launched in Zaire.



The power connection of Zaire's municipal headquarters to the National Electricity Network (RNE) ends within two and a half years, announced on Friday, 28, in the city of Kuimba, the Minister of Energy and Water, João Baptista Borges.

When intervening at the launch of the electrification project in Zaire province, the governor ensured that the financial, technical and human conditions for meeting the contractual deadlines were guaranteed.

According to the official, the project aims to increase the supply and expansion capacity of electricity distribution services through the construction of new substations, transformation stations and home networks throughout the province of Zaire.

The Minister took advantage of the occasion to inform that the inhabitants of Soyo and Nzeto are already benefiting from energy from the Cambambe dam, Cuanza Norte province, and later from the Soyo combined cycle. The same is true for the people of Mbanza Kongo, Kuimba, Nóqui and Tomboco.

Included in the Public Investment Program (PIP), the contract will be executed by a Chinese company and will last for 30 months.

The Minister of Finance, Archer Manguera, the governor of Zaire, José Joanes André, the Chinese ambassador to Angola, Cui Aimin, secretaries of state and national directors of various ministerial departments attended the launch.

The province of Zaire has a population of 594,000 and 428 inhabitants distributed in the municipalities of Mbanza Congo, Soyo, Cuimba, Nzeto, Tomboco and Nóqui.
