Welcome & Prayer (5 mins)

Prayer

Proclaim Gospel: John 3:16-18 (10 mins)

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

1. What does this passage/reading say to you? Or what struck you?
2. Define what God's love means to you? What is love?
3. Describe your Confirmation. What do you remember? What was the highlight of that day? Do you remember the saint you picked, why and their story.
4. How would you describe the Holy Trinity?

Commitment (5-10 mins)

Make a commitment that your family can do together this week or individually.

- Examples:
1. Do something to educate yourself more about the Holy Trinity
 2. Help a neighbor in their yard
 3. Pray for our 2nd grade students, as they receive their First Holy Communion next Sunday
 4. Pray to a different person of the Trinity than who you normally pray to
