

ADMINISTRATION .. handles personnel services, finance, contracts and grants.

BOMB SQUAD .. responds to bomb threats and devices with removal and disposal capability.

CHAPLAINS .. provides victims services, counseling programs and religious activities.

COMMUNICATIONS .. operates county wide radio network providing dispatch and E-9-1-1 services to many police and fire agencies.

COMMUNITY SERVICES .. informs and educates citizens through public programs & media, organizes crime prevention programs and activities, including TRIAD crime prevention programs for senior citizens, Law Enforcement Explorers, Deputy Brisco, and neighborhood watch.

DETENTION CENTER .. modern high-rise jail with a capacity for almost 2,900. A youth oriented *Reality Check* ✓ tour & program can be scheduled.

DIVE TEAM .. equipped with rescue boats, provides swift water rescues and underwater search and rescue operations.

FLEET MAINTENANCE .. in-house services maintaining 200+ vehicles.

INVESTIGATIONS .. investigates crimes, processes crime scenes, and provides investigative and technical assistance to local agencies.

JUDICIAL SERVICES .. serves civil process, evictions, summons, lock-outs, victim protective orders, warrants, holds property sales, and provides extradition of persons arrested out-of-county & out-of-state.



PATROL .. patrols unincorporated areas, assists other agencies, conducts mental health evaluations, operates bomb and drug detection dogs, trash cop, animal welfare officer, and traffic safety programs.

PROTECTIVE SERVICES .. escorts prisoners to court appearances and provides courthouse security.

RECORDS .. maintains records on criminal investigations and inmates, processes passports, SDA applicants, other criminal records, warrants and digital imaging services.

RESERVE .. trained citizen volunteers who help during special events, emergencies, community services, communications, patrol, records, and use car, horse, ATV, and bicycle units which save more than a million tax dollars each year.

SUB-STATIONS .. provide easier access to services for citizens, a safe place for child visitation exchange, and provides an office for deputies working in the area. Sub-stations are open in Deer Creek, Quail Springs Mall and Midwest City.

TACTICAL TEAM .. team trained and equipped to respond to high-risk incidents including hostage, warrant service, and barricaded suspects.

TECHNICAL INVESTIGATIONS .. assists investigators in processing crime scenes, collecting evidence, fingerprint ID, and lab and photo services.

TRAINING CENTER .. classrooms, driving track, and firearms ranges for basic and advanced training.



THE OFFICE OF SHERIFF

The Sheriff is an elected constitutional officer with a 4-year term. The primary duties are to keep and preserve the peace; suppress riots, unlawful assemblies and insurrections; serve process papers in civil and criminal cases; arrest persons charged with crimes; take custody of persons arrested for state offenses by law enforcement agencies; and operate the county jail. The Sheriff has law enforcement authority throughout the entire county of 720 square miles with 700,000 residents, provides primary law enforcement services to unincorporated areas and assists local law enforcement agencies serving cities and towns.
