Matthew 21:4–5 — ^{"4} This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet: ⁵ "Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Behold your King is coming to you, Gentle, and mounted on a donkey, Even on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.' ""

- A. It was noted by Matthew that Jesus came as the prophet said (*Zechariah 9:9*)
- B. Jesus has made it obvious for us to recognize Him as more than just King:
 - It was not until the resurrected Lord stood before Tomas with nailed scarred hands that Tomas said, "My Lord and My God."
 - 2. Do you recognize Jesus as your Lord and your God?

Matthew 21:8–11 — ^{"8} Most of the crowd spread their coats in the road, and others were cutting branches from the trees and spreading them in the road. ⁹ The crowds going ahead of Him, and those who followed, were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David; Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest!" ¹⁰ When He had entered Jerusalem, all the city was stirred, saying, "Who is this?" ¹¹ And the crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth in Galilee."

A. Jesus expected to find prayer to rise up from a Holy temple:

Matthew 21:12-13 ¹² And Jesus entered the temple and drove out all those who were buying and selling in the temple, and overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who were selling doves. ¹³ And He said to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer'; but you are making it a robbers' den."

B. Jesus expected people to come to Him so as to be healed.

Matthew 21:14 *"* And the blind and the lame came to Him in the temple, and He healed them."

Matthew 21:15-17 ¹⁵ But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the wonderful things that He had done, and the children who were shouting in the temple, "Hosanna to the Son of David," they became indignant¹⁶ and said to Him, "Do You hear what these children are saying?" And Jesus said to them, "Yes; have you never read, 'Out of the mouth of infants and nursing babies You have prepared praise for Yourself'?" ¹⁷ And He left them and went out of the city to Bethany, and spent the night there."
