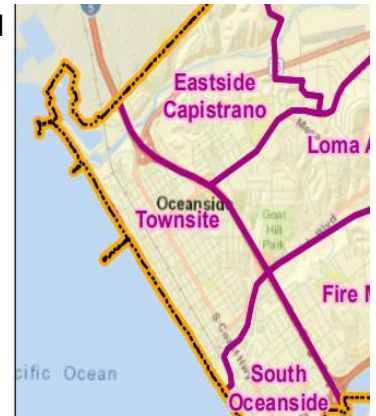

### DID YOU KNOW . . .

Right now, there are no local or foreign markets for mixed plastics all of which we put in our bins...

Originally, Western countries carefully sorted their plastics and paper by using separate bins and collections. China, desperate for raw materials began taking all the recycling the world could send it.

**In 2018 China declared a stop to this polluting practice refusing to take material with >.5% contamination.**

This ended the shipping of recycling materials from the US and Europe! "Recyclables" piled up and are sent to landfills or burned for energy.

**Only clean cardboard, paper and a few plastics are re-made into new products.**

The recycling number on the bottom of plastic products is a marketing plot to make consumers feel better about buying plastic products. Only products with the numbers 1-6 are easy to melt down and remake, i.e.: Beverage bottles, milk jugs and laundry detergent bottles are the best. Most plastics can only be restructured 3 times before they lose their strength and flexibility.

**Moral of this story: use as little plastic as you can and buy things in glass or metal when possible AND**

- Refill all kinds of products at **Oceanside's Sonora Refillery** on 1012 Coast Hwy and BYOB!
- Contribute clean recyclables to organizations fundraising efforts.
- Put only CLEAN plastics, glass, and cans in the recycling blue bin.
- Compost vegetable food and paper waste at home.
- Bring your own containers for leftovers when going out to eat.
- And, don't be a litterbug!

### NON-TOXIC WEED KILLER RECIPE:

Spring has sprung and so have all the weeds! Save money and the environment by using an effective home-made weed killer with products probably already in your kitchen!



**1 gal white vinegar + ½ cup salt + 2 Tbl Dawn type dish soap**

Instructions: Pour a little bit (1/2 cup) vinegar out of the bottle, add salt and dish soap, close and swirl to combine. Pour into spray bottle and Voila!

So, for \$3.50/gal vs. Roundup at \$20-\$25/gal, know you are helping the earth, our children, pets, little creatures, and butterflies too!

**This will kill any plant so be careful where you spray!**

### BUTTERFLY SEASON - HOW YOU CAN HELP!

The population of monarch butterflies needs help. It is shrinking each year. You can help by planting milkweed! But what kind? How many? When?

If you want to be assured of having butterflies visit your garden the easy answer is Tropical Milkweed or *Asclepias curassavica* from Mexico. It has very showy red or yellow flowers.

It has been used in Oceanside with great success.

Planting a few plants together will attract more butterflies than just one by itself. As a person who farms the monarchs, I've released many a butterfly using this cultivar. There is some thought that this plant is promoting the California Monarch to stop migrating. This plant does not go completely dormant in our climate. The butterflies do not migrate and this exposes the population to increased disease susceptibility. When planting both tropical and native milkweed, the butterflies will only lay their eggs on the tropical.

Now is the time to plant, there are already chrysalis in my garden. Make sure you have plenty of milkweed available in your yard and you will be helping to save the California monarch!
