I wanted to mention that any volunteers will need to complete the attached security form. I have cut and pasted the instructions below:

To complete registration and receive your credentials, you need to:

1. **Complete and print the attached Form 5512**

- For Box 25, put 'Richard Erie' (leave DOD# blank); for Box 26, put '757-444-4573'.

2) **Bring your completed Form 5512 for final processing** to one of the below locations during the dates/times below:

Early Pick-up Location:

Manhattan: First deck of Pier 88, south stairwell landing on May 20th and 21st, 8:00am to 4:00pm. (Badges from all sites can be picked up in Manhattan May 20th - 21st).

Pick up Locations beginning May 22nd:

Manhattan: First deck of Pier 88, south stairwell landing, 8:00am to 4:00pm.

Brooklyn: Fleet Week Command Center in terminal, 8:00am to 4:00pm.

Staten Island: Security Trailer, 8:00am to 4:00pm.

3) **ALSO Bring approved identification for your final processing.** Approved identification can be found on page 3 of Form 5512.

You will either need to bring one item from List A (passport, green card, etc.)

OR

one item from List B (state ID, driver license, govt ID, etc) **AND** one item from List C (SSN card, resident ID, birth certificate, etc.)
