Church Council Minutes

The Trinity United Church of Christ, Elliston Church Council met on January 11th, 2015 at 7:00 pm. Amy Mathews, President called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm. and Steve Turnow opened with prayer. Those in attendance were as follows:

President – Amy Mathews, Vice President – Ed Gahler, Recording Secretary – Desirae McCloskey, Financial Secretary, Nyla Denman, Deacons – Dwayne Hoeft and Jim Buhro, Elders - Ken Gahler and Connie Gahler, Trustees – Marty Hoeft, Dale Bodnar, Steve Turnow and Doug Avery. Pastor Kyle Timmons and Church secretary Rhonda Mahaney was present as well.

First order of business was Kyle installing the council members prior to the council meeting items. There will be an official installation of the council members on Sunday December 17th during the church service.

Reports:

Recording Secretary: Meeting minutes from the last council meeting on 12/14/2015 were read prior to the meeting. Motion to accept the minutes for the past meeting was made by Ed Gahler, 2nd by Jim Buhro. MC. Meeting minutes from the congregational meeting on 1/11/2016 were silently read during the meeting. Motion to accept the minutes for the annual on January 1/11/2016 was made by Dale Bodnar, 2nd by Dwayne Hoeft. MC.

Secretary Report: The following items were discussed:

- Rhonda is need of a signature for the continuation of the church to be a not for profit organization. Ed Gahler noted he will sign the paperwork.
- Reminder to please check the mailboxes within the coat room for any committee mail
- Rhonda will be on vacation the following days: Feb 15th, June 3 & June 6, June 9-10, June 20-24 (4H Camp) and July 18-22 (Fair). No issues were noted with these requested days off.
- Due to the 2016 church council, new check signers will be all set starting tomorrow.

Financial Report:

Financial information was reviewed. Details regarding the Amazon activity was discussed due to the activity showing during the month. Steve Turnow moved to accept the financial report. Jim Buhrow 2nd. MC.

An audit was performed for July-December by Veronica McMonigle. The summary of the audit was reviewed by the council members. No issues were noted. Motion to accept the financial audit was made by Desirae McCloskey, 2nd by Connie Gahler.

Pastor Report: Kyle is starting to meet everyone and get situated with the church. He appreciates the patience and support he has received in the last eleven days and is looking forward to 2016.

Committee Reports:

Worship – Nothing to report.

EFY –

- Still looking for volunteers for branching out, specifically 1 volunteer to have a teacher for each week of the month. Additionally, class sizes are

growing, therefore, any additional volunteers to assist would be greatly appreciated.

- Council also discussed the start up of Sunday school again for all ages. Kyle will brainstorm ideas as to what to do relative to this item, however, if anyone has any ideas you would like to bring forward would be great.

Mission – The committee is busy planning more wonderful events for the church. The upcoming events are as follows:

- The mission committee will be providing dinner at church camp. Dinner (sloppy joes) will be at 7 pm on Friday night.
- The Not So Newlywed game will be held on February 14th at 5 pm. A full spaghetti dinner will be provided, cost will be \$10 per person.
- Father/Son Banquet will be in March, with the Mission committee looking to have some involvement with the banquet.
- The Antique roadshow will be held on April 9th. The Mission committee will be serving food at the event. Cost will be \$25 per person per item for appraisal. The item must be able to be carried in (no furniture, guns, automobiles). The roadshow should be able to appraise 35-40 items in a 2.5 hour span. If you are not bringing an item, you do not have to pay.
- The committee also wants to get more involved with the Northwest Association, therefore, more announcements will be going out as it relates to activities happening thru the association.

Church & Ministry – Have not met recently, therefore, no update to provide.



Search Committee –

- Search Committee met on January 6th at 7 pm. The following items were discussed:
 - Please make a conscience effort to try and sit closer during the church service. This will allow for visitors to feel more comfortable as spaces in the back will be open.
 - If there is anyone that wants to be involved with the services, please let Kyle know.
 - A suggestion was made to hang signs to assist visitors in navigating thru the church (i.e. ceiling signs for branching out, bathrooms, kitchen).
 - Kyle will put together a list of hospitals, nursing homes, and government assistance locations to allow for members to contact these locations for when members are within these establishments. It will make the sending of cards and visiting easier as the members will have the information readily available.
 - A gathering time with Kyle will occur every Wednesday at 6:30.

- Lenton services will be held at the church at 7:15 on Wednesdays. Note, we will not be doing shared services with Zion this year.

Old Business:

Movement of Sound Board – Movement of sound board is almost complete. A few more items are being worked thru. Other items being worked on as it relates to the sound within the church are as follows:

- Installation of the subwoofers and movement of the speakers is still in progress.
- Sound within the balcony and cry room will be worked on next.
- Carillon system is currently being worked on as well.
- Installing of the acoustical panels to help with the quality of the sound is being looked into. They are currently looking into the correct products to determine how much the panels will cost.

Discussion was held as it relates to adding a screen at the back of the church to assist with the flow of the service. Ed Gahler made a motion to continue forward with the proposed third screen to be placed in the back of the sanctuary. To pay for the expense, Ed proposes to first use the remaining money in the audio/visual fund. If additional money is needed, he proposes to then use the funds within the memorial fund. 2nd by Dale Bodnar. MC.

Estate Committee – Have not met since last meeting, still looking for two more individuals to join the committee in order to proceed with any further action.

Trustee Report – Nothing to report. Doug Avery to contact Don Tabbert to see if he is willing to plow the church again during the winter season.

Parsonage Committee: Current members are Doug Avery, Ron Giesler, and Jayson Hayes. They are working on the potential proposal for selling vs. keeping the parsonage. An update will be provided at the next council meeting.

New Business:

Kyle suggested coming up with a ‘Vision’ team to consider what/where we will be in 5-10 years, including what projects we want to do and start building towards the future. Anyone is asked to come with ideas and join the Vision team.

Amy brought up funeral bereavement for Saturday could use food donated.

Darrell Opfer commented that there was mention of having another \$5 offering to support the Baumann family. Pastor Kyle will announce on 2/21 that we will receive that offering on 2/28.

Discussion was also held in regards to giving towards the \$5 offering v. the church benevolence program. A recommendation was made to have someone from council say something at the next congregational meeting about what the benevolence fund is, and its purpose.

Pastor Kyle stated that he will work on an upcoming sermon on giving/tithing and address this issue.

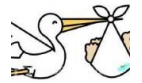
