Hard Love

My Dad came by his anxiety disorder very honestly. As a prosecutor for the City of Cleveland, he prosecuted organized crime during an era in the 1970's in which Cleveland had such an intense rivalry between organized crime groups that it was known as "the car bomb capital of the world." There were over 70 car bomb assassinations during my dad's tenure as a lawyer prosecuting major organized crime cases.

One day I picked up the phone and a person started making death threats. I hung up and asked Dad what that was about. He shrugged and deflected the question.

But clearly chronic stress worked its malignant effects on Dad's physical health and emotional and social well-being. He fell into the common trap of trying to self-medicate his anxiety with alcohol and ushered in some very dark years for my family and himself. He retired from law very early, having achieved great success very early but not meeting the very high expectations that early success had prompted. My Mother in particular became very bitter and what could have been a pleasant retirement with some decent financial planning became a horror show of blame and recrimination.

Their human faults and weaknesses were overwhelmed by the depth of the world's corruption.

I can testify that God saved us. Not in fifteen minutes like some sitcom resolution or with contrived coincidences or some cheesy angel's intervention like a Hallmark movie. It involved God's grace giving us the courage to practice hard love, difficult grace, complicated forgiveness, and perplexing patience. And in God's grace Dad did stop drinking, the marital strife did not quite heal but vastly subsided. My siblings and I all learned that even wonderful people can experience passages in life's journey that are soul diminishing and harrowing. Yet if you can hang on to your faith, even by just a thread, that faith can bring about tiny bursts of grace that accumulate and even, eventually promulgate simply amazing love, healing and well-being.

The steady love and prayers of my parents' church friends played a major role in helping my siblings and I cope with our parent's dark passages. Society does not honor the social capital represented by the sacred friendships forged in church fellowships. Yet they are priceless. The realm of God is indeed a "pearl of great price" more precious than any object we can imagine. It is hope, healing, love and joy.

The steady love and prayers of my parents' church friends, played a major role in helping my siblings and I cope with our parent's dark passages. Society does not honor the social capital represented by the sacred friendships forged in church fellowships. Yet they are priceless. The realm of God is indeed a "pearl of great price" more precious than any object we can imagine. It is hope, healing, love and joy.


