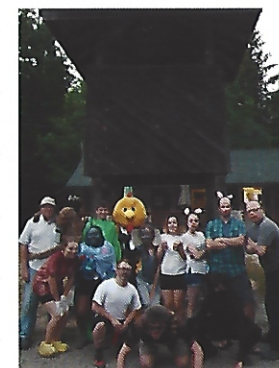

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## Cabin Counselors & Counselors-In-Training

Living alongside Campers during their time at Camp is one of the most life-changing experiences...for Volunteers and Campers alike! We need an adult (21 or older) and student leader in every single cabin. These folks help Campers successfully navigate sharing space together, as well as participate alongside the Campers during all activities during their stay at Camp. Leading conversations, Bible studies, activities, and guiding Campers through personal and inter-personal dynamics while maintaining your own calm, mature presence are all key parts of this important role.

## Wellness Counselor

The needs of our Campers have changed over the years. It is clear to us that we need a trained professional present who is able to walk alongside our Campers as they struggle with issues involving anxiety, trauma, abuse, ADHD, autism, or any number of other special needs. Often our Cabin Counselors or CITs are not equipped to manage these needs, and are also taking care of multiple Campers at a time. We now require a Wellness Counselor to be present who can bring their expertise to provide extra helps and tools for all.

## Camp Grandparent

Grandparents hold a special place in our hearts and memories. We want to build a bridge between generations by providing Campers with a Grandparent figure while also having an extra adult present for all activities who does not need to be lodging in a cabin with Campers.

## One-On-One Buddy

Some Campers have special physical and emotional needs that require one-on-one management. This could be help navigating life alongside peers, keeping themselves on track, or even managing hygiene. They may have an adult person at school who walks alongside them during the day and we want to provide this same tool for some of our Campers in order for them to be successful while here at Camp.



## Camp Medic

One of the most important jobs during our camps is the role of the Medic.

This person is responsible for checking-in and checking-out Camper medication, monitoring and distributing those medications, and being available for medical needs that develop throughout the week/end. Common situations include tummy aches, dehydration, scrapes, and bumps. The Medic also keeps records of all medical information for each Camper that is then returned to parents and kept on record. A person who is a professional in the medical field is preferred.
