So far, with the spay/neuter voucher program, 14 dogs and 30 cats have been spayed and neutered! We have adopted out 59 animals, saved 72 animals, and sent 12 to a rescue. We have expanded our "one" play yard into "three" sections! We launched our F.A.C.E.S of FOSS program. This is a "program," but it also includes what Friends of Stokes Shelter stands for, our Mission Statement. Friendship, Acceptance, Compassion, Education, and Socialization. FOSS welcomed 3 groups from the Reading Buddy program, Journey Impact School, North Stokes Beta, and the National Honor Society Clubs.

Our dogs and cats have been shown on WFMY, FOX8, and WXII. We welcomed a new Vet of Record, King Vet, Dr. Aldridge, celebrated our volunteers, had a pup fly on an airplane, and celebrated our 5 year anniversary. We received a grant from the NCVMA District 5. As you can read, there is so much for us to be proud of. This adoption center is growing by leaps and bounds and we are so thankful for each of you that have made this possible!





I met Jasper in late August after a friend of mine saw his picture online posted by Friends of Stokes Shelter. The only story she could tell me is her friend sent it to her, and she sent it to me because they knew I had Gunnar, who was a 3-year-old Berner - Gunnar turned 4 in January this year.

When I met Jasper on a very hot day in August and I brought Gunnar with me to see how they would do. Jasper immediately followed Gunnar around and when Gunnar would lay down, Jasper would lay down beside him. Jasper was 62lbs to my 120lb Bernie who lives in the lap of luxury and air conditioning at his choosing. I noticed his hair was so thin and I couldn't tell if someone cut his hair or if it was so thin because of malnutrition, but we would figure all that out. I called my daughter on the way home to tell her I was on my way home and to meet me outside. When we pulled in and I let Jasper out she screamed in excitement, and he ran right to her. They have been inseparable ever since. My oldest took one look at him and asked about his story. I said, "I really don't know but he needs to gain some weight." Grayson said, "Don't worry mom, we got this" and proceeded to make him a peanut butter sandwich twice a day in addition to his 2 cups of food for breakfast and dinner. His first weight check he weighed 72 lbs so we knew we were on the right track. Jasper and Chloe are always together, and he sticks to her like Velcro when she is home. When she's not home, he sleeps in her room. He was very intimidated by men mostly at first, but we started to socialize him a lot. He's met the lacrosse team. His first outing to watch a pick-up game in January it was snowing like crazy, and he loved it. He met lots of people and the players loved him. We started taking them on walks across the street at the elementary school when school was out and let them run off leash. They will run and run and run until they are tired.. That's about 20 minutes for Gunnar LOL. Now Jasper gets in the car if we open the door no matter if we are taking him or not.. And the funniest part is trying to get him out of the passenger seat when Chloe is driving. Chloe accidentally left a box of Crumble Cookie on the counter and left for school. I was not home and came back to an empty box. Gunnar has taught Jasper now to counter surf and get anything that isn't pushed back far enough. So back to Crumble Cookie I went before Chloe got home, while those two laid around in a sugar coma. We took Jasper to the vet a few weekends ago for a weight check and he's now a whopping 91 lbs. His hair is fluffing up and getting curly like Gunnar's and he's still Velcro when Chloe is around. He lays around all day and every morning pounces on Chloe's bed to wake her up. He's not going to be happy when she goes off to college - but that's not for 3 more years (we won't tell him that yet).

My neighborhood is very small, so it's hard to avoid other dogs. The bathroom issue seems to be improving a bit. He also didn't seem to be fully potty trained, as he is still going inside even after recently being outside. I am trying to give him a lot of praise when he goes outside, but this is an issue we're still working on. Another thing we are working on is relaxing when we see dogs, cats, etc when inside. Wyatt has a habit of running to every window in the house at full speed, crying and usually knocking something over, once he spots something. He even pushed my screen out when I had a window open. We are working on settling down and not being so fixated.
