What does that mean to you, from now until December 31st, 2020, all membership renewals and new memberships will be reduced from \$40 to \$30. Many of you may be saying that your current membership doesn't expire until next year. That's okay. If your current membership expires April 30th, 2021, by paying early, your membership gets extended to April 30th 2022. You will not lose any months of membership by paying early. There are two very easy ways to pay your dues early. You can use the "Venmo" app and make a payment to @VFW7397, the information will be captured and your dues will be paid. Or can send payment directly to our Post Quartermaster Bob Moyer, by mailing a \$30 check directly to him or to the post.

Don' forget November 11th is Veteran's Day. Be on the lookout for Veterans Day events or parades depending on the current situations. This year Johnson County is recognizing World War II veterans as we have had several anniversaries this year. We will pass along any information as it becomes available.

It's time to get out there and recruit! We want to see every Post put in a new member before the end of the month, and help launch us into some great recruiting momentum for the end of 2020!















The MOC is an Honor Degree for the VFW and this Pup Tent was started at the VFW Post in KCK when the was a Strawberry Hill Post. When it closed, the Pup Tent was moved to VFW Post 56 in Leavenworth and now to try an expand the group, we are working on making it a traveling group that will meet in District 1 & 2 of the Kanas VFW. Today we meet in Leavenworth and Lenexa, working on adding one more post in each of the two districts. Each post would host 3 meetings per year.

Founded in New York City on September 17, 1920, the **MOC** is based on the principals of good humor and fun. Since 1923, our first year as a part of the VFW, the Cooties have worked hard to further the aims of the VFW while adding to it the frivolity known as Military Humor to the serious work of our parent organization. What would ultimately become known as the VFW National Home for Children, a sprawling campus of homes located in Eaton Rapids, Michigan, started out as the brainchild of the MOC.





We have <u>cancelled plans for breakfasts for the remainder of the year</u> and will review the situation in January to determine if buffet style breakfasts will be permitted and continue to explore alternatives if they are not.

The last Thursday of the month the Riders normally attend an End of Month (EOM) ceremony at Leavenworth National Cemetery to honor our brothers & sisters that have passed away since the last ceremony. The National Cemetery is still not allowing group activity but is allowing support for some funerals.
