Mars UP is my ninth church in thirteen years – frankly, there is nothing I haven't seen. Personally and professionally, I have encountered a multitude of challenges and opportunities in ministry. I am not afraid – God will lead us through our current challenges and (again) into a brighter future.

I have many thoughts on how to proceed (once I figure out the keys and the light switches), but my first task will be to meet as many of you as possible, to hear your thoughts and ideas – not just on the past, but on the future. The other thing on my list is to *earn the right to be heard*. If we are to work together, there must be an environment of trust, openness, clarity, and unity. Otherwise, nothing will happen.

One more thing – first and foremost, I will be your pastor. In spite of my experience, I am a pastor, not a consultant coming in to "fix" Mars UP. I look forward to building relationships with every one of you.

No one, least of all me, knows what lies ahead. But I DO know God is in charge, and even though we cannot see the future, we must remain hopeful and be certain that God will bless our steps.

It will be my honor and privilege to serve you and the Body of Christ called Mars UP Church.

Please join me in the journey.
