OPERATIONS

Don and his part time team are busy raking up leaves, preparing and bark mulching common area landscape beds and keeping up with work orders as they come in. We have several drainage issues along Donald Drive entrance and Kelly Court. We are getting quotes on those areas that need outside services to do and are preparing to take care of those areas we have the equipment and expertise to do. A lot of time and effort have gone into getting

all our equipment, trucks, and lawn care equipment ready for the season. Lawns that have been damaged by plows are being addressed and if you have some damage and we have not addressed it yet, please submit a work order so we don't overlook it. The response time is extremely good for work orders and issues that are being pointed out that need maintenance staff attention.

Starting May first our full-time assistant to Don will be on board. Luke is as anxious to get started as we are to get him started on having an impact on the team and the maintenance of our community buildings, landscape and infrastructure. I cannot express how lucky we have been at putting together a team in such a short period of time.

We elected to not do any replacement of roads this year, but we have lots of issues with potholes and deteriorating roads that will be addressed with the team this summer. We will be using hot-top instead of cold patch to go around the community to repair areas that are in need. A new hot top compactor UTILITY has arrived, and we expect that CONSTRUCTION **AHEAD** will help us to do repairs that last.

As I mentioned at the board meeting, the infrastructure for the power lines that run through our community will be replaced this year in late summer or early fall. They should not disrupt our access to homes and getting around in the community and before they start there will be information forwarded to all of the community.

Dark Brown Bark Mulch and Loam will be available for delivery by the maintenance staff if you would like. The price is \$40/yard for Loam and \$45/yard for Bark delivered and you must order by the yard. Orders can be placed at the office with the volunteer receptionists.

Leaf and branch pick up is on Thursdays. Please have your leaf bags and branches at the curb by 7:00 am. A quick reminder that leaf bags cannot be used for branches as these leaves need to break down for purposes of creating mulch. Also, a reminder that small metal items are picked up on the first Monday of the month. If you are in doubt about whether it can be picked up, please call me at the office to be sure.

One last item to talk about this month: The board voted to return to the policy of putting names as well as the house number on the signs that go on your outside light pole. If you are one with only the street number on your sign and want your name as well, please submit a work order in person to the office with your signature on it for us to order it.

Until next month, enjoy this great spring weather we have looked forward to since fall left us last year.



about a nice pasta salad to go with it, and a couple of easy to make, warm weather desserts for later? Here you go—enjoy!

Pasta Salad with Peas, Tomatoes & Parmesan

(makes 6 servings)



Ingredients:

1 cup rotini (tri-color works well) 1/2 cup green beans

1/2 cup peas, frozen

6 cherry tomatoes

- 4 tsp. Parmesan cheese, grated
- 1 Tbs. herbs, mixed (basil, mint, parsley), finely chopped
- 1 Tbs. olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, small salt, to taste pepper, to taste

Directions:

- Cook the pasta in salted water according to the package directions. Drain and cool slightly. Set aside.
- Peel and chop the garlic. Sauté lightly in the oil. Deglaze slightly with some of the pasta water.
- Add the beans and peas.
- Halve the tomatoes and add them to the pan with the peas and beans.
- Simmer until the beans are tender and the peas and tomatoes are warmed through.
- Remove from heat and add to the rotini. Mix together, adding the salt, pepper, and chopped herbs.
- Sprinkle with grated Parmesan, and serve either warm or cold.

Fruit Salad with Cool Whip and Pudding

(makes 10 servings)

Ingredients:

- 1 8 oz. Cool Whip
- 1 package instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1 can pineapple tidbits with juice, 20 oz.
- 1 cup strawberries, sliced in half
- 1 cup raspberries

1/2 cup green grapes, sliced in half 1/2 cup red grapes, sliced in half 2 medium bananas, sliced

Directions:

• Pour the pineapple juice into a large bowl. Add the instant pudding mix and stir with a whisk until smooth and creamy.



- Add the Cool Whip and stir with a whisk until it's smooth. Do not over-stir.
- Add the fruit, stirring in each type carefully with a large spoon until they are combined.
- Cover with plastic wrap and chill in the fridge for at least an hour before serving.
- Plate, serve, and enjoy.

Lemon-Blueberry Nice Cream

(Makes 4 servings)

Ingredients:

3 medium ripe bananas, sliced and frozen 1/4 cup lemon juice 1/4 tsp. vanilla extract

1/4 cup cold water, as needed

3/4 cup frozen blueberries

Directions:

- Place frozen banana slices, lemon juice, and vanilla extract in a food processor.
- Process until it is smooth, adding cold water to loosen the mixture if necessary.
- Transfer to a bowl and stir in the frozen blueberries.
- Serve immediately or store in an airtight container in the freezer for up to a month.



Here's a little something extra, to take advantage of those luscious strawberries in the market (if you use frozen, make sure to defrost them overnight and drain well before making this recipe; otherwise, you'll wind up with strawberry slush!)

Strawberry Mimosas

(makes 6 servings)

Ingredients:

1 quart fresh strawberries (about 3-1/2 cups)

1-1/2 cups orange juice

2 cups champagne, chilled (or non-alcoholic sparkling wine of your choice)

Optional: orange slices or sliced strawberries for garnish

Directions:

- Place strawberries and orange juice in a blender; cover and blend until they are smooth.
- Press the mixture through a fine mesh strainer.
- Pour about 2/3 cup of the mixture into each champagne flute, topping with 1/3 cup champagne. Garnish each with a strawberry and an orange slice.
