# FROM THE PASTOR

July 21, 2019  
Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
Lk 10:38-42

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

**"If you steal my sunshine"** Martha's sister Mary doesn't say this in today's gospel, but she could describe Martha's attempt to pull her away from Christ with these 1990's lyric from the band LEN! Mary is basking in the glow of Jesus' presence and absorbing His wise teaching. (Imagine Peter James and John also saying that on the Transfiguration Mount Luke 9:28-36--when told its time to come down the mountain--They want to stay in Jesus's Sunshine). Around the home's halls, Martha is hurried and anxious about household duties. She interrupts Jesus to force Mary into the kitchen service. Yet, Jesus holds off getting into the domestic mix, by calling Martha by name *twice* and pointing out the serene posture of Mary (a learning disciple at His feet). Mary's peace ('sunshine') cannot be stolen. And Jesus wants Martha to have that peace, too. I wonder about Martha's motivation. Is Martha a classic overachiever? Is she a Type-A micromanager? She is good at what she does, knowing her way around the house, and keeping the schedule on time and everything in its place. Yet, people are not managed successfully if they are treated like dinner vegetables or furniture settings. Martha seems accustomed to having things done her way. She does defer courteously to Jesus as a house guest, but her attempt to manipulate Jesus into fulfilling her will on Mary fails. In effect, Jesus says, "Martha, you run a good business, being efficient and crafty. But Mary over here has something to teach you too." The lesson: The Peace and Presence of God cannot be forced. People try to expedite and upsell God's delivery of grace to them by manipulative prayers and demonstrative piety but grace (true gift) arrives only when we surrender to God. Jesus points this out in Matthew 11:12, where he says, "From the days of John the Baptist until now, the kingdom of heaven suffers violence, and the violent are taking it by force." Jesus is aware that people attempt to impose their will on God, by their own works or logic. Maybe it is like saying, "*God, I am serving you and doing good: Now continue this, and bless this great project of mine! It is all for you!*" But Wait! If it is really for God, have we checked in already with Him? Has He signed off on our pre-flight plan? More likely, we are headstrong and pushing our own glorification by demands for recognition of our idea or program. I think Jesus tells us to relax. Continue the good work but do not coerce our thinking and willing into it too much. Imagine it like wrapping a fragile gift. If we handle it too much or keep positioning and moving it around a lot, often it will either chip, break or collapse. I think of such careful surrender to God similar to how difficult it is to wrap those modern children's toys that have those open-face boxes (they are not easy shapes like rectangles--No, they are cubist and have odd angles like polygons or polyhedrons). To wrap these shapes, one has to be so careful or the paper tears and corners get bungled! (I have learned this the hard way—it used to offend me when my nephews would say "Brian we can tell you wrapped our present!") So it is with God's will and our work. If we force in our will/way over God's, some good may result but it will not be lasting or for true glory of God. Ultimately it will bring our frustration, now or later. Yes, we must apply ourselves to every good work, yet also we must release our control over the whole process (especially over other people) to allow God's providence. The old popular license plate "*God is my co-pilot*" has it wrong. No, **God should be Pilot**, and me serving as simply an assistant and just attendant!

Thinking of 'Kitchen Martha' made me remember a great guy I worked with in several church picnic kitchens. He was religious about slow cooking the green beans. Too much stirring of the big pots made the bean pods all come apart--and then we served only loose beans and green slips instead of whole good green beans! Putting our hands/spoons in the pot too much spoiled the serving! Same with God's will. We do our part and trust God for its completion. Mary teaches us the importance of going first to Jesus, and then taking up our work--tasks. In that order, we can carry our peace into our work and the work will bear its best fruit for everyone affected. In that earlier quote I offered above from Matthew 11:12, Jesus pointed out the futility of violently 'grasping' at the Kingdom. I love how Jesus ends that chapter by saying just this in Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and **I will give you rest.**" This is a Perfect Solution for Martha's anxiety. Go first to Jesus in prayer and He will insure our work being completed according to His will. And Peace will be ours, before, during and after our work is completed!
