The Chairman and the Thief By C.B.

Ephesians 2:8-10 – For by grace ye are saved through faith; and that not of yourselves; it is a gift from God: Not of works, lest any man should boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

To fully understand **GRACE** we must distinguish what makes it different from Mercy. Imagine being an employee of a bank. Through the years, you have figured out a way to secretly embezzle small amounts of money without being caught. Because you have gotten away with the crime for so many years, the amount you have stolen piled up into the millions. It is at this point that an audit reveals what you have been doing.

After the investigation you are called in by the chairman and presented with records proving without a shadow of a doubt that you are a thief. You wait for the pronouncement of the verdict and imagining the dire future before you, only to hear the chairman say, "My son, I forgive you."

MERCY - to be absolved of the punishment you deserved and the stigma that comes from being guilty for your wrongdoing.

JUSTICE - is when you receive the punishment for your wrongdoing.

MERCY is when you are pardoned and the punishment that is due you are not meted out. As you attempt to catch your breath, you are given yet another shock when the chairman says, "You are free to go home, and I forgive you." All of this is incredible, but GRACE is much more.

GRACE is when you came to the office the next day to collect your belongings and find out that the chairman has moved you up to the executive floor and made you not just the vice chairman but has offered to adopt you as his son. That is GRACE, when you start getting privileges you don't deserve. When you reach the penthouse, the chairman ushers you into your new corner office. Flabbergasted by the turn of events, you don't know how to react.

As you look at your new surroundings, the perks and privileges, the chairman leads you to the glass window and points to what's happening in the street below. Just then you see the chairman's son handcuffed and being led to the police car.

Because the chairman was Just and Holy, he would not short circuit the righteous process. Sin must be atoned and paid for. But because of His great love, His son offered Himself as a ransom for me, the thief. This is what God has done. At great cost we have been **GRACED** by God.

The dumbest thing to do at this point is to go down to the old office and start stealing again-or worse, to steal even more because now we have the backing of the chairman. This is what we do when we flash grace as a license to sin against God and our fellow man. We have been promoted to sonship, but we choose to live like slaves.

But GRACE is not just access given to us by God; it is also the power to live out that relationship every day in this present life and not just in heaven. Acts 1:8 - "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you ..." For the Grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men. It teaches us to say "NO" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age. The right response to this Grace is for Your Mercy, and the GRACE to be Your son. What a privilege, in fact, I am so overwhelmed by Your kindness, I would like to dedicate every day of my life to learning to be just like You. The fact is, I have not met anyone like You. Again, thank You very much. And may I say, I love you so very much too.

GRACE is not a license to sin against God. GRACE is the pass card to a relationship with God.



My "Wilderness" By R.E.

My name is Reggie and I've been in prison here in California, this time, for the last 18 years. I'm a lifer under the California 3 strikes law. I'm also a very devout Christian. One of the guys in my pod always shares a copy of your newsletter with me. As a matter of fact he always lets me read it first. Your April 2014 edition had a story called God's Perspective on Suffering by D.G. That story was only another confirmation for what I know my calling is in life, and why my life was what it was, and how I had to endure what I did in order that I could be a strong soldier for Christ. All these years I've spent in prison have been my "wilderness", and as Paul had to go to Arabia for 3 years, this is my "wilderness".

I am 56 years old and have had one heck of a life, but God is my life and I do know why my life was what it was. Your newsletter is a very positive instrument for the believer and for those soon to be believers.

God is always willing to help whenever we call upon Him. I have been finding solace in my Bible. I have actually read quite a lot of it, and will continue to read it every day. Then I'm trying to build a relationship with my father, whom really has no understanding of the trials and tribulations of prison life. Then I'm trying to strengthen my faith with my heavenly Father, and to not let it be a 'sometime' type of relationship. It should never be only when it's convenient; however, we get so caught up in the day to day life. But I am seriously trying.

Lastly ... me. There are so many things I'm trying to change within my own personal life. I don't know where to start. But I do know one thing, I want to be able to look at myself in the mirror and love what I see. Now, I know the list I just made wasn't quite in the correct order. It's just hectic and yet I feel like I won't ever get started because I can't or won't put complete trust in Him. I'm still stuck thinking, "I got this." Silly me.

Foot's Bible Study Rotes

1 Kings 19:1-21:29

Elijah experienced the depths of fatigue and discouragement just after his two great spiritual victories, the defeat of the prophets of Baal and the answered prayer for the rain. Often discouragement sets in after great spiritual experiences, especially those requiring physical effort or involving great emotion.

To lead him out of depression, God first let Elijah rest and eat. Then God comforted him with the need to return to his mission, to speak God's words in Israel. Elijah's battles were not over; there was still work for him to do. When you feel let down after a great spiritual experience, remember that God's purpose for your life is not yet over. (19:3)

When we are blinded by envy and hatred, it is almost impossible to see our own sin. (21:20)

Ahab was more wicked than any other king of Israel (1 Kings 16:30; 21:25). But when he repented in deep humility, God took notice and reduced his punishment. The same Lord who was merciful to Ahab wants to be merciful to you. No matter how evil you've been, it is never too late to humble yourself and turn to God, and ask forgiveness. (21:29)

Acts 12:1-13:15

We can trust God's leading because He has promised to destroy all evil eventually. In the meantime, we know that God will help us use our suffering to strengthen us and glorify Him. (12:2-11)

Prayer changes things, so pray often and with confidence. (12:5)

We must never exclude anyone whom Christ has called to follow Him. (13:1)

There is a time to be nice and a time to confront. Ask God to show you the difference and to give you the courage to do what is right. (13:10)

Psalm 136:1-137:9

God deserves our praise because His endless love never fails. God's love includes aspects of love, kindness, mercy and faithfulness. We never have to worry that God will run out of love because it flows from a well that will never run dry. (136:1)

God destroyed Babylon and its offspring for the proud assault against God and His children. The Medes and the Persians destroyed Babylon in 539 B.C. Many of those who were oppressed lived to see the victory. The phrase about the infants is harsh because the psalmist is crying out for judgment "treat the Babylonians the way they treated us." (137:8-9)

Proverbs 17:14-16

If we know that starting a quarrel is only going to open the door to a huge argument, do we ever stop to think that whatever the point is, is it really worth all the stress and drama? Many people will start an argument just to prove they are right. When you step back to look at it, who usually ends up looking like a fool? So if you already know that whatever you are going to talk about will start a quarrel wouldn't it be better to just drop the matter all together before a dispute erupts.

It is senseless to pay tuition to educate a fool who has no heart for wisdom. It would be foolish to throw away hard earned money to educate someone who has no will for it. Would not our money be better spent on someone who is true to the search for wisdom, or someone who could be a great worker for God given the opportunity to gain more wisdom? Use your money where it will do the most good, don't just throw it away. (17:16)

So the Lord led me to start group Bible studies. They went well until I was written up for preaching. This was all later dismissed and we are allowed to have Bible studies at recreation. Through this, we have seen a fire lit in many lives here and the Word heard by guard and inmate alike. So please pray for us here as we stand on the foundation of Christ and deal with the spiritual battles against the devil. We may not understand the will of God, but we know He will never leave us and the Holy Spirit will help us overcome the trials and tribulations we face in this life ... **P.B.**

Right now, I would really appreciate it if you all could keep me and my three oldest in your prayers. In April, I received a petition from the courts informing me that my children had been removed from the home of their father and paternal grandma due to some serious physical abuse, and that it was reported to CPS by their school. Thanks to the Lord someone cares - they are both facing criminal charges. It all hit me like a ton of bricks, I'm 5 years in with 5 left and I feel so powerless. However, one good thing has come of the situation; it has built a relationship with the Lord. It is not perfect yet, because after being a control freak for going on 29 years, it's hard to give the reigns over to someone else. But I'm actually enjoying my Bible time every day, thirsty for knowledge and understanding. This situation has made me fall to my knees, and be humble asking for advice from the CO's, the counselors, even some of the girls. I ask almost everyone to pray for me and my children. I love to be told Scriptures to turn to, I love all the positive feedback I have received, most of all I've seen that even the gangstas in here care. They're really softies. Well, if you could all keep me and my babies in your thoughts and prayers, I would be very thankful ... N.L.

But only a miracle can make that prayer come true. Please keep me in your prayers and that I find someone special that I can enjoy life and the Lord with. I can't keep doing this alone, I need an angel. Please pray for my new cellie and his wife. Also, pray that we find peace in our cell and I can learn to like him and tolerate him for he acts ignorant and young and wants to be seen as hard ... J.M.
