

On Tuesday, December 7th, the *third annual* Pearl Harbor Day ceremony was held at Fort Wadsworth. This year's event was sponsored by the National Park Service and hosted by Commander Pat Miserendino, Kells-Grennie Post #316, and Commander Eustace Kiriakos, Masonic War Veterans Post #6.

Phil Melfi of the National Park Service, representing Janette Parker, Acting Superintendent of the Staten Island Unit, gave the welcoming address. Our own Post Adjutant (and former County Commander of Richmond County), Elias Arout, served as Chaplain and led the attendees in prayer. This was followed by the Pearl Harbor address which was given by Alfred Debard, State Adjutant General of the Masonic War Veterans.

Following the speeches, Commander Pat Miserendino tossed a wreath into the harbor in remembrance of all those who gave the ultimate sacrifice in the defense of freedom. Then, Captain Emery Chagon led our Honor Guard in firing a salute in memory of our fallen comrades. Taps was then played ending this solemn ceremony. Afterwards, all the attendees had lunch at the United States Coast Guard galley at Fort Wadsworth.


