

Clifford Township Supervisors Meeting January 2, 2018

Business meeting held on Tuesday, January 2, 2018. Chairman Dennis Knowlton called the meeting to order at 7:19 pm. Motion to approve the minutes by Mr. Knowlton, second by Mr. Searle. All in favor. Treasurer's report reviewed and will be put on file. List of bills reviewed. Mr. Searle made a motion to pay bills, second by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor.

Old Business: Mr. Marcho reported that the townships Ford 550 sold for more than the estimated price.

Atty. McGraw will be writing a letter for supervisors' approval to proceed with putting a lien on the property of the abandoned mobile homes on State Route 106.

New Business: Mr. Marcho made a motion to approve the Spedding subdivision, second by Mr. Searle. All in favor pending approval by DEP and the county.

Mr. Searle and Mrs. Hertzog will be attending the 96th annual PSATS convention in April.

Atty. McGraw read proposed resolution #1-18 regarding House Bill 1620 in which the township would still have a say in where wireless broadband towers are placed. Mr. Searle made a motion to sign it, second by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor.

Mr. Searle made a motion to pay a fee to GoDaddy to keep the townships website secure. Second by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor.

Road Master, Kurt Booths, was asked to contact PennDot concerning erosion issues on State Route 106.

Attention was drawn to fast moving trucks going through town and it was asked if someone could call the truck company or if a phone number could be posted for people to make complaints.
