

#### Member Staff Development: Judging Procedures by Billy S.

#### **Key Points:**

itoy i omit

- Billy S. stressed the need for judges and he passed out sheet for members to sign up to iudge.
- This year's sheets are easier that last year. We will use the same sheet for each car type.
- The top of the sheet: Class, year, make, and model will be filled out and placed on the windshield.
- Judges will move out, as a group and Billy S. will count out cars. Judging will be done in pairs. If you are a new judge you will be assigned to a more experienced judge.
- New for this year is a 5-point Bonus category. Since we scoring the sheets as a deduction, if the owner is AT his/her car they receive 5 points (ZERO) deductions. If the owner is NOT at his/her car they lose the 5 points (5 point) deduction.
- John K. asked the question: "How do we judge the interior if the owner is not available? Billy S, ruled it's a full deduction if you can't see the area it cant' be judged. Try to find the owner.
- When using a deduct system, at the judges discretion, see the amount of items in a line. Eg. Exterior Body flt: hood, trunk, doors, and all panels, and see what each fraction is worth.

•

• All tops shall be UP. Announcements and instruction sheet will state this. If a car is a convertible, it will get full points, so that coupes and convertibles can start off equal.

•

When judging the interior, look for interior condition and cleanness.

.

• When using the deduct system, take off a minimum of ½ point deductions.

•

• Jeff asked if judges could judge cars that they are most familiar with. Billy S. said the new judging sheet reduces the need for specific car knowledge. If you are uncomfortable, judging a particular car see Billy S. for assistance.

•

• Jeff asked about survivor cars. Billy S. said first what car is it? Is it a 50 year old, never repainted car or a 2017 C7? Give the older car a break. Survivors should be judged with their peers. When judging Corvettes this problem is reduced because we will be judging the corvettes by classes. All C-3's are approximately the same age.

•

 When a car is judged, the judges are required to total the deduction column. It is important to remember this the not the score it is the deduction. John K. will do the calculations. A perfect car is 80 points. When the total deductions column is subtracted from 80 you get the NET Score.

•

A question was raised about the contents of the trunk and floor matts. Billy ruled that floor
matts can stay in. You must be able to see the trunk matt. Frank indicated that the criterion in
the past was the car should be the way you bought it. Billy S. said we are more relaxed and
our goal is to have fun for the owner and the membership. Given the competition from other
car shows, we want our quests back.
