

The Acmar Community Quilt

Austin Stone has shared his family story which is in the dedication in his upcoming book, **Ghosts of An Empire.** This book is dedicated to the lives and memory of John Dwight Lawley and Vivian Isabelle Lawley, just two in the millions of hardworking, honest Americans that weathered two world wars, the Great Depression, and the massive changes the world experienced as it entered the 21st century. It is a very well researched, detailed account of the people and events that led to the creation of the Alabama Fuel and Iron Company and its work in St. Clair County, and will be released sometime in 2026.

John Lawley, known as JD, was born in 1907 and his wife, Vivian Newton, in 1912, both in St. Clair County. The two met later in life and were married in 1930, standing by the banks of the Cahaba River. The couple had five children: John, Carolyn, Helen, Brenda, and my grandmother, Imojean. JD found employment in the nearby Markeeta Mine in 1928, and as many men in the area did to survive, rented a small house across from the company commissary in Markeeta. He was working a job at the tipple, above ground and out of the mine.

In 1930, newly married JD transferred employment to the Alabama Fuel and Iron Company, working in the Acmar Division and being sent underground to load coal by means of pick and shovel. Working grueling shifts in nightmarish conditions, facing asphyxiation, rock falls, explosions, and mine car accidents while Vivian raised the children, kept the house, prepared food (often times grown from gardens tended by the family and livestock raised) and kept the family's lives together.

Despite raising five children (one child being handicapped) on a miner's pay in the midst of the Great Depression, JD and Vivian scraped together enough money to purchase a tract of land not far from their rented home in Markeeta and provide a new home for the family with plenty of acreage to farm and feed mouths the old-fashioned way. As the years went on and the world around him changed, coal miner JD found himself obsolete and out of a job as the Alabama Fuel and Iron Company shut down in 1950. The company's idyllic and tightly run model towns faded into the kudzu, and the era of an empire came to a close.

Men and their families, desperate for work, left Acmar and Markeeta in droves. But JD and Vivian, ever resilient, remained in the family home and JD found employment with the Western Grain Company (later Jim Dandy) and worked for another 19 years, finally retiring in 1970 and being diagnosed with black lung. JD and Vivian remained together until 1993, when Vivian left this mortal life at the age of 80. JD continued to live with his daughter Carolyn on his property in Markeeta until his own death in 2000 at the age of 93. At the time of this writing, the descendants of JD and Vivian have been living on the property earned by the sweat of their brow and blood of their hands for four additional generations, and I am proud to pen this writing from the same ground my great-grandparents toiled their entire lives to earn, and this will be a reminder for my daughter, Margaret, to grow up knowing where she came from.
