there is usually about 45 minutes. Elizabeth Danos is the coordinator and is happy to answer questions about serving in this ministry.


Altar Guild

become the caregivers to their parents. As she puts it, we become our mommy's mommy. Additionally, her father whom she loved very much, died early and she carried grief for him for over 20 years. She tried to make all her boyfriends into her father.

The best part of this week's group was the outward expressions of our love for each other and our need for each other as well. What a fantastic group!!! In September, we would love for you to come be a part of something special. Think and pray about it. We meet in person and over Zoom at 10 AM.

Madagascar Happenings

ATwo weeks ago, I reported that James Wong, Archbishop of the Anglican Province of the Indian Ocean would be making his first trip to Madagascar since the beginning of COVID. He and his wife arrived on May 3 and left earlier this week. They visited Antananarivo (the capital), Toliara town and Ambovombe, a part of the Fort Dauphin District.



At Ambovombe, the people did a folk dance for the Archbishop. There is a picture below of Bishop Samy (on the left), the Rev.

Canon Donne (on the right) and the Archbishop and his wife in the center. Notice the women on the far right. They all created special lambas for the occasion which were all the same. Many of the women and girls also did their hair in a special creation to celebrate the Archbishi's visit.

Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) also flew a contingent of people around the area so the Archbishop could see the damage caused by Cyclone Jasmine. (For those who were in the book study of The Detour, MAF flew Todd and Patsy up to northern Kenya several times.) There is a picture of the group before they boarded the plane at the bottom of this article as well.

I had a wonderful experience this week at Sue and Simon Babbs'. I was picking some things up from Sue and got there as they were having a live chat with Gaston (Priest in Amboasary) and his family. Sue brought me over to the computer and introduced me to Gaston and his wife, Oliviah. There were 5 children in the house at the time and they all ran over to behind Gaston and Oliviah and started waving and yelling "hi" to me. It was nothing but beautiful little faces all smiles and waving hands. What a fantastic few minutes!!!!

Next Wednesday, May 25, will be a Child Sponsorship board meeting over Zoom with people from the US, UK, France and Madagascar. This will be my first board meeting and I am very excited about joining these extremely committed people. I will report next week anything about new projects and how the sponsorships are going. St. James the Less in Northfield has finally started sponsoring children and I know at least 5 children are being sponsored as of now.

I was recently asked who the people in the Prayers of the People are whose names are hard to pronounce. Currently, we have 20 children being sponsored so I split them up into 4 groups of 5 and each week of the month we pray for 5 of those children. So, here's a good assignment for each week: take your service booklet over to the picture wall and find the 5 kids for each week. Find out who each child's sponsor is, how old they are and what they want to be when they grow up. In other words, get to know them. We put their pictures up there so you could do that. Just because you are not sponsoring a child does not mean you can't be supportive in prayer.
