Lottery Questions and Answers

Can you stay anonymous if you win the lottery in Canada?

Provincial lottery corporations have rules that require winners to publicly disclose their identity and take part in lottery public relations activities, such as having their photo taken with an oversized cheque.

How long after winning do you get the money?

Once you have come forward with the winning ticket, you can expect the typical scenarios: Small prizes up to \$600: Paid out immediately. Mid-range prizes: Paid out on the same day or the next banking day. Jackpot prizes: Paid out in 5 to 10 banking days.

How big is the lottery industry in the U.S.?

During fiscal year 2019, U.S. lottery sales totaled over \$91 billion (USD).

What are some of the biggest wins in the U.S.?

The last decade boasted some of the biggest lottery wins of all time, including a whopping \$1.586 billion Powerball jackpot in the US in 2016—the world’s biggest ever jackpot. The winners were three



couples who split the winnings between them.

In 2019 The biggest lottery payout to a single winner in U.S. history was from a \$1.537 billion jackpot in the Mega Millions lottery this year. The anonymous winner from North Carolina chose to take home a lump sum which amounted to \$491.7 million after tax.

Another big win was the Powerball jackpot of \$687 million

in 2018. Lerynne West, a single mom of three won half of the prize money and decided to set up a foundation in the name of her grandson who died in the same year. According to its website the Foundation offers financial aid in the areas of children’s health, poverty and hunger among other issues. The other half went to Robert Bailey from New York City. Bailey used the same combination of numbers every week for 25 years before he made his big win. He said he would continue to play the lottery regardless of his big win and continue playing his numbers “until this train runs out!”

Merle and Patricia Butler from Illinois were winners of the \$656 million Mega Millions jackpot in 2012. The couple’s first purchases with their winnings were a new car and tickets to St. Louis Cardinals games, their favorite baseball team.

What about biggest lottery prizes outside the U.S.?

Elsewhere in the world, the Spanish Christmas lottery holds the record for the biggest payout, offering total prize money of over 2 billion euros (\$2.2 billion).

Gaming News

JERSEY IS NO. 1

Nevada is now the second-largest online sports betting market, with the much more populated New Jersey now No. 1. Hard Rock Digital will be able to operate in the Garden State through its brick-and-mortar casino Hard Rock Atlantic City. But in Nevada, Hard Rock presently does not have a land-based casino to partner with to conduct mobile sports betting (mobile sports betting and online poker is legal in Nevada, but not internet slots and table games).

SD SAYS NO TO ONLINE BETS

A panel of state lawmakers has turned down a proposal that would have let people across South Dakota use the internet for legal betting on sporting events. The House Taxation Committee voted 11-1 against HB

1231 that Representative Tom Pischke sponsored. It would have required all of the bets to go through servers at casinos in Deadwood. But the bets could have been made from mobile devices, personal computers, businesses with licenses to sell liquor for on-site consumption, other locations that could accept advanced deposits, and Deadwood casinos, so long as they were within South Dakota. South Dakota voters in the November election approved a constitutional amendment allowing the Legislature to establish sports wagering in Deadwood.

NUGGET TAKES NEW YORK

Golden Nugget Online Gaming has signed a deal with Tioga Downs racetrack to gain market access to New York’s potential iGaming market. Subject to speculation and regulatory uncertainty, industry stakeholders are showing their interest to secure a share of a potentially regulated online gaming market in

the Empire State. The deal signed between the racetrack and Golden Nugget extends for a period of 20 years, showing the brand’s confidence that New York will secure a regulated industry before long. Tioga Downs owner Jeffery Gural said that he was excited and welcomed the opportunity to be teaming with one of the best online gambling companies in the country.

RICHMOND RESORT CASINO

Bally’s Corporation, a U.S. gaming company, has submitted a proposal to Richmond, Virginia, to build a \$650 million World Class Resort and Casino. According to the proposal, Bally’s Richmond Casino Resort would consist of a 4-star hotel, superb dining amenities, pool and spa, state-of-the-art casino, and sportsbook, and a place for live entertainment conferences. The resort and casino could provide job opportunities to 2,000 employees, annually attract 3.7 million visitors, and generate a profit of \$415 million per year.

Fun Bunch Bingo

Proving that there is always a way to make the best of a tough situation, members of the Escalon Fun Bunch hosted a successful day of Bingo playing for local senior citizens this past winter. The special event was put on at the city's Community Center and was a socially distant competition, staged in the parking lot. "Players were directed to back their cars in and tune their radios to our Bingo station," explained Fun Bunch committee member Tina Jensen. "Each person was given a Bingo card, treat bag and game sheet." City council member and frequent local event emcee Robert Swift called several games and when someone got a Bingo, Jensen added, they were required to honk their horn and turn on their flashers. Once a Bingo was certified by a Fun Bunch organizer, the player was rewarded with a prize. "This was such a fun event for everyone involved," noted Jensen.

Bingo Boosts Businesses

A competition is underway to help business in Berlin, Connecticut, and it's called "Berlin Bingo." To check off a box on your game sheet, a unique task needs to be completed at a business in town. "Everything from buy a coffee, burger, pizza, even visit a martial arts or a dance school, just to go in and see it, or a showroom," said Berlin Economic Development Director Chris Edge. With every Bingo, you're entered to win a handful of gift cards donated by other local businesses. "I think it will be a fun thing," said Sandy Amato, a case manager at Good Cause Gifts, a nonprofit which aims to create valuable opportunities for Connecticut residents living with disabilities. You could check off quite a few boxes at Good Cause Gifts like: "buy a gift or service for a family member, pet or friend" or "spend \$5 at a business that supports a cause you believe in."

Tech Aids Church Bingo

Social events, including church Bingo nights, had been off the table for months at the River Oaks 5th Ward of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in West Jordan, Utah. Many of its congregants are elderly and, during the pandemic, have not been leaving home or socializing. Listen Technologies has supplied its Listen Everywhere system to allow the HOW to host a socially distanced Bingo event in its car park so congregants could get together safely. "To facilitate the event, I used the Listen Everywhere LW-100 server," said Carl Brewer of the River Oaks 5th Ward. "The idea was to give the community a way to gather while remaining physically distanced for safety." Listen Everywhere delivers clear audio via Wi-Fi to a free app on iOS and Android devices. Using the system, the church broadcast the audio from the caller's microphone to participants' smartphones or tablets. From there, participants could listen on their devices or connect the audio to any Bluetooth device, including car stereos or Bluetooth-enabled hearing aids. The master of ceremonies called bingo numbers, asked trivia questions and joked with the community members. The church served dinner, drinks and treats to participants in their cars during the drive-in event. The bingo night attracted nearly 30 cars, with about 80 participants in total. Once everyone was set up, they had a great experience safely connecting with friends. Church leaders didn't need to worry about spreading the virus via common surfaces or contact because there's no shared equipment. "I heard from several people that it was fun to get out of the house and have something to do together," Brewer added. "Once people were set up, they had a great time. People in our community could connect for a few hours outside of a virtual call, and we all had fun."

Volunteers Wanted!

Hi Guy,

There are a couple of Bingos I go to that seem to be scrambling to do all the stuff that needs doing on game nights. I asked a couple of the workers what the problem was and they said the same thing: they don't have enough volunteers to work the Bingo. The minute they said it I recognized that this sure was the problem. It is a shame seeing these people who are there volunteering their time, getting stressed out trying to make the games run well and the Bingo players happy.

It seemed to me a good question to ask you because I am

sure there are games all over with this same problem. What do you suggest that would help Bingo games find more volunteer help? — **GG, via email, Ohio**

Hi GG,

Any organization that relies on volunteers to operate constantly faces the challenge of finding enough volunteers to help do the job successfully. Bingo players need to remember that without workers, charity Bingos cannot run...often resulting in the games closing their doors. And we certainly don't want that!

You did not say what types of organizations are sponsoring the Bingo games in question. If they are fraternal organizations like the Moose or Elks, they need to reach out to their membership at meetings or through email or newsletters that they are short-staffed and need some new workers. Religious organizations need to tap fellow church members from the pulpit or through the church bulletin and express the need for help. Another good source might be area high schools and colleges, where community service is encouraged and organized.

In all cases, the message must be that Bingo exists not just for entertainment purposes, but to provide vital financial support to people and programs doing good work.

By the way, GG, you might consider volunteering yourself. I think people who play Bingo would enjoy seeing the game from the other side. And who appreciates the importance of keeping "their" Bingo games going than those who play?

Granted, the downside is that if you are working at Bingo you can't be playing Bingo, but who says you can't do both? Volunteering at one game per week while playing at others is a good deed well done, while helping insure the future of Bingo in your community. — **Guy**

VA, Fitbit Team Up

Do you have a Fitbit activity tracker? If so, the Department of Veterans Affairs has a free program for you.

The VA and Fitbit have hooked up to provide one year of free membership to eligible veterans who have the device. This couldn't have come at a better time, when we need more exercise, less stress and better sleep at night.

Up to 10,000 veterans (including caregivers and VA staff) can get one free year of Fitbit Premium, which includes a health metrics dashboard, guided programs and more. Plus, you'll have access to coaching. Check healthsolutions.fitbit.com.

Eligibility will depend on a few things, such as whether you already use Fitbit and where you are. A bonus for veterans who already use VA healthcare: You might qualify for a Fitbit Sense, which is the Fitbit health smartwatch.

If for some reason you can't get into the Fitbit program, you have other options for exercise and working out. Step one is to call the gyms closest to you and ask if they offer anything for veterans. CrossFit, Gold's Gym, 24 Hour Fitness, OrangeTheory and numerous others offer discounts and special deals for veterans. Don't forget to try the non-chain locations. If you're eligible for Medicare, check into the Silver Sneakers program at local gyms; many Medicare plans will pay for that.

Near a base? If you're retired, are a MOH recipient or have a disability rating of 100%, you can qualify to use the gym on base.

For at-home equipment, if you're a Veterans Canteen Service (shopvcs.va.gov) member, check out the prices on equipment such as rowing machines and exercise bikes. Look online for a FreeCycle group in your area (freecycle.org), an online listing of items people are giving away. There are 5,300 groups across the U.S. Finally, don't forget [Craigslist.org](https://craigslist.org) for people selling equipment near you.

How to Choose a Hospice Care Program

Dear Savvy Senior,

Where can I turn to find a good Medicare covered hospice provider? My husband's mother has a terminal condition and wants to die at home, if possible, so I'm helping out where I can. —**Sad Sandy**

Dear Sandy,

Hospice is a wonderful option in the last months of life because it offers a variety of services, not only to those who are dying, but also to those left behind. Here's what you should know about hospice care, along with some tips to help you choose one.

Understanding Hospice

Hospice care is a unique service that provides medical care, pain management, and emotional and spiritual support to people who are in the last stages of a terminal illness—it does not speed up or slow down the process of dying. Hospice's goal is to simply keep the patient as comfortable and pain-free as possible, with loved ones nearby until death.

The various services provided by a hospice program comes from a team of professionals that works together to accommodate all the patients' end-of-life needs.

The team typically includes hospice doctors that will work with the primary physician and

family members to draft up a care plan; nurses who dispense medication for pain control; home care aids that attend to personal needs like eating and bathing; social workers who help the patient and the family prepare for end of life; clergy members who provide spiritual counseling, if desired; and volunteers that fill a variety of niches, from sitting with the patient to helping clean and maintain their property.

Some hospices even offer massage or music therapy, and nearly all provide bereavement services for relatives and short-term inpatient respite care to give family caregivers a break.

Most hospice patients receive care in their own home. However, hospice will go wherever the patient is—hospital, nursing home or assisted living residence. Some even have their own facility to use as an option.

To receive hospice, your mother-in-law must get a referral from her physician stating that her life expectancy is six months or less.

It's also important to know that home-based hospice care does not mean that a hospice nurse or volunteer is in the home 24 hours a day. Services are based on need and/or what you request. Hospice care can also be stopped at any time if your mother-in-law's health improves or if she decides to re-enter cure-oriented treatments.

How to Choose

The best time to prepare for hospice and consider your options is before it's necessary, so you're not making decisions during a stressful time. There are more than 4,300 hospice care agencies in the U.S., so depending on where you live, you may have several options from which to choose.

To locate a good hospice in your area, ask your mother-in-law's doctor or the discharge

planner at your local hospital for a referral, or you can search online at [Medicare.gov/care-compare](https://www.Medicare.gov/care-compare), which provides lists and ratings of hospice providers in your area.

When choosing, look for an established hospice that has been operating for a few years and one that is certified by Medicare. To help you select one, the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization offers a worksheet of questions to ask [CaringInfo.org](https://www.CaringInfo.org).

Medicare Coverage

Medicare covers all aspects of hospice care and services for its beneficiaries. There is no deductible for hospice services although there may be a very small co-payment – such as \$5 for each prescription drug for pain and symptom control, or a 5 percent share for inpatient respite care. Medicaid also covers hospice in most states, as do most private health insurance plans.

Because advertisers support the paper, geographic location is a key part of how large or small an edition of the Bingo Bugle can be. In Small City USA, where there may be no casinos and far fewer Bingo halls to contribute to the paper, there are less advertising dollars available to pay the bills, so the paper will be smaller than in a major metropolitan area.



Two Soups To Take Off The Chill

It is awfully cold in Minnesota. Can you find me a recipe for an easy to make soup? Thank you. — *Ilona from Minnesota*

Dear Ilona,

Here's a real easy soup to prepare. Hope you like it too! Stay safe and healthy! — *Annie*

CORN SOUP

- 4 cups fresh, canned or frozen corn
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 4 tablespoons finely chopped onions
- 4 teaspoons salt
- white pepper, to taste
- 4 cups milk, divided
- 4 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 pint heavy cream
- chopped parsley
- crumbled bacon

Combine the corn, butter, onions, salt, pepper and two cups of milk in a large skillet.

Simmer for 15 minutes. Pour into a blender and mix until smooth. Stir remaining milk into the flour, pour into a saucepan and add the corn mixture. Cook, stirring until thickened. Add the heavy cream and heat thoroughly. Serve garnished with the parsley and/or the crumbled bacon. Serves 8.

I recently had a soup made with beets at a friend's home. It was really delicious. She called it by a different name, but I am too embarrassed to ask her what it was. Can you help me find a recipe for this soup? — *Janice from Buffalo, New York*

Dear Janice,

Borscht is the name of this soup that originates from Europe. Most people think it is either from Russia or Poland. Here's the best recipe I have for Borscht. Enjoy. Stay safe and healthy. — *Annie*

MY MOM'S BORSCHT

- 2 bunches beets
- 1 pint sour cream
- 1 quart water
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 2 eggs
- salt
- lemon

Peel and boil the beets in a quart of water until soft. Remove the beets and allow to cool. Allow the beet water to cool too. Beat in the eggs, milk and sour cream to this water. Add the salt and lemon to taste. Grate the beets and add to the soup. Serves 8.

What's New in Nevada

A PIECE OF OLD VEGAS

When the El Cortez changed the carpet on its gaming floor this past January as part of ongoing renovations, officials sensed customers would be interested in having pieces of the matting pattern as memorabilia and made it for sale in the gift shop. In a testament to the pull the casino has with the vintage Las Vegas crowd, the strips almost immediately sold out, officials said. They sold 100 strips of rose-heavy floral pattern from the excess rolls in storage (not the carpet that was in place for 12 years) for \$19 apiece. "We were wondering what the big deal was with the carpet," general manager Adam Wiesberg joked. "I sold 100 pieces, but we could have sold thousands." The worn carpet was equally popular. After workers placed the torn-out carpet in waste bins on the property, employees had to chase off dumpster-divers who wanted a piece of Las Vegas history, Wiesberg said. "There's a cult following for that carpet," Wiesberg said. "I don't know, maybe some people thought that was the original carpet from 80 years ago."

DRIVERLESS CARS

If you see high-tech looking cars and vans with the "Motional"

logo on them making their way around Las Vegas, they're Level 4 autonomous vehicles, which means fully driverless, and they're undergoing testing on the city's public roads. Unlike Aptiv vehicles, no safety driver is behind the wheel, though a Motional employee riding shotgun can stop the car. So far, however, no interventions have been necessary. Motional is a joint venture between Hyundai and Aptiv, whose self-driving vehicles have completed more than 100,000 rideshare trips in Las Vegas over the past several years. So far, the Motional vehicles are sticking to residential areas, though they're allowed anywhere and could soon be seen on higher-traffic thoroughfares.

GREYHOUND RELOCATES

After nearly fifty years in operation at the same convenient location on Main Street downtown, the Greyhound Bus terminal has been displaced by The Plaza with its 48,500-square-foot building that will eventually incorporate the station area in the hotel as a dining and/or retail venue. The terminal has moved way on down south to the RTC South Strip transfer station on Gillespie Street off Sunset Avenue near Las Vegas Boulevard.

In Poker, Anonymity Has its Perks

Anonymity can be a powerful thing in poker. After all, if your opponents don't know who you are or how you play, it's all the more difficult for them to play against you. However, success often means exposure, and in poker it doesn't take long for the spotlight to shine on the winners.

The power of anonymity was demonstrated in a hand from the 2020 World Series of Poker Main Event, which was held online on WSOP.com in December.

The hand took place with blinds at 2,500-5,000 plus an ante of

500. Sitting on a stack of about 174,000 in chips, Daniel Negreanu, arguably the most widely known poker player in the world, raised to 10,000 under the gun. Action folded around to a player with the online handle "22NevaLoose," who had about 407,000 in chips and fittingly held 2h 2d in the big blind. Little did anyone know that was the screen name of Faraz Jaka, a World Poker Tour champion with more than \$6.8 million in lifetime tournament earnings.

Jaka was known to the masses, but his screen name wasn't. He called to see a 5s 4d 5c flop and then checked to Negreanu, who continued for 7,000. Jaka woke up with a check-raise to 19,200.

Negreanu gave it a little thought before folding. It seemed like an innocent enough hand, but there was a lot of strategy going on beneath the surface.

Jaka dove into his thought process in a Vlog on his "FarazJaka" YouTube channel.

"The reason why I made this play is because, first of all, we're going to have a lot more 5-x in our range from the big blind, whereas him under the gun isn't going to have any fives at all," Jaka said. "I am going to be able to check-raise a lot there with a lot of my fives, and he's going to have to fold a lot of overcards. I'm not trying to get him off his pairs, I'm trying to get him off just things like K-Q offsuit, A-Q offsuit."

Jaka continued: "He's supposed to float with most of his (overcards) with backdoor flush draws. That said ... I didn't think he knew my screen name. So, from his perspective it was just a random player in the WSOP check-raising him, and most players aren't going to be check-raising deuce there. ... He should have been calling had he known it was me."

Jaka correctly pointed out that check-raising gave him a better shot of realizing his equity while denying Negreanu his. Jaka also had a plan for how to proceed on the next street.

"If the turn card is an eight or lower, it's going to benefit our range in the big blind more, and we're going to continue betting," Jaka explained. "If the turn card it a ten or better, then we're going to be doing a lot more checking."

Jaka assumed Negreanu would have played it differently had he known who he was up against. He was right, as Negreanu said later on Twitter.

"If I knew that was you," Negreanu tweeted, "I 100% would have called your check-raise."

That's the power of anonymity in poker.

Diamonds have always had the glitter and players are drawn to the challenge of lining up double or triple gems. With Blazing 7s, there's the promise and excitement of bigger paydays than plain old red, white and/or blue 7s. An easy call was the popularity of Wheel of Fortune; the first game to offer the big bucks of a multi-site progressive jackpot plus a theme and bonus round.

Enter the two games that have a shorter history, but are now recognized on the top five list: 88 Fortunes and Quick Hit.

Below are descriptions of the latest versions that are now part of the brand for each.

Next, looking towards Future Trends: When I think of slot makers who have made their mark with an arcade game origin, Konami comes to mind. Now make room for Synergy Blue who combine the excitement of classic video games with skill influence that results in some big coin at a slot machine.

Toss in the alliance with social gaming available on your mobile device and you have entered a future gaming trend.

Four new titles include:

- 1) **Blizzard Blast**, a progressive sporting arctic characters offering a blast of winning opportunities.
- 2) **Zombie Heat** featuring ten settings to zap the space zombies.
- 3) **Joyride Jackpot** brings on racing excitement via five unusual courses and the choice of 8 high-performance race cars.
- 4) **Royal Dragon Saga**, boasting an Asian-theme featuring royal dragons, free spins and wild symbols.

It can truly be said that this lineup offers something different in the gaming and gamers world.




