We are partnered with numerous coalitions, non-profit agencies, churches and food banks to deliver our services who are a huge contribution of advertising, supplies, and clients to provide service without running out four resources. \$775,000 of combined in-kind giving and cash / 15,000 continuity of business funds. (In non-Covid years)
