BY LAWS OF THE APOSTOLIC FAITH BIBLE COLLEGE, INC. Article VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- * Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages
- * Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- * Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- * Destruction of the wicked
- * Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.


We have actually had unseasonably warm weather on

Where Has The Holiness Gone? How's My Behavior?

I've noticed (from personal experience) that we don't like to be told how to behave our self. I mean we're grown people... aren't we? I've heard it said that although we don't know exactly how old the human race is, you'd think we'd be old enough to know better. But it seems we don't! Man left to his own devices (vices) has failed miserably...or very successfully failed (however you look at it).

How many times when growing up we were told to behave ourselves and then followed something to the effect of "cause if you don't.., or just wait till your father hears of this...(hmm)?"To me, "behave yourself" meant don't touch what I shouldn't, go somewhere or do something that would hurt me, someone else or their property, cost money that we didn't have...etc. However, good the intentions were of people telling me to do this made me 'feel' like they didn't think that I knew how to conduct myself without being told; like I was ignorant or something (imagine that!)

I grew up with parents that were concerned enough about me to discipline me when I did wrong; by not letting me go or do what I wanted or sometimes by letting me live under the guilt of my conscience, There were other ways that didn't seem pleasant for the moment, but I was taught that there would be and are consequences to right and wrong conduct. That's not hard to understand...is it? According to choices we make, we reap the action. If a person has unprotected sex (even protected) and gets a baby or disease, if they rob a bank, beat their spouse or a thousand other actions, there will be a reaction. I've seen signs on the back of a truck sometimes that read "how's my driving?" followed by a phone number to report complaints if the driver's performance is bad or reckless. Although an absurd gesture, how would it be if we as Christians wore a visible sign that asked "How's My Living? To complain call the Employer."

Webster's dictionary says that behave is to act in an acceptable way, to act properly, to conduct oneself in a proper manner. Do I act in a way that is acceptable to Him? Do we present ourselves properly as representatives of Him when we are in public (and in private)? How are our manners? (And I'm not talking just about at the dinner table.)

Have you ever heard (I mean really heard) the saying "What you do speaks so loudly I can't hear what you are saying?"Do we have a do as I say mentality or a do as I do? But I can just hear it now, "I'm a Christian. God loves me and set me free to do as I want because He's forgiven me. Don't judge me... it's my decision." If you believe that, you've been reading your Bible wrong.

There are several scriptures that should speak to us about this issue. I Samuel 18:5 reveals that 'David behaved himself wisely' and later records in Psalms 101:2 states a vow and profession of Godliness (that it may be good for me to make) "I will behave myself wisely in a perfect way... I will walk within my house with a perfect heart." He also stated in Psalms 31:2 "Surely I have behaved and quieted myself".

In the familiar 'love' chapter of I Corinthians 13, verse 5 tells us that "charity... does not behave itself unseemly," Paul the Apostle also reminds the people in I Thessalonians 2:10 "Ye are witnesses, and God also, how holily and justly and unblameably we have behaved ourselves among you that believe." (Could we make that boast") In speaking to the aged women in Titus 2: 3, Paul writes that they should, "be in behavior as becometh holiness".

Need I go on? I could. God wants us to conduct ourselves like men and women of His. Now I suppose the question could be raised that once we realize that we need to correct some (or maybe all of our behavior), how do we do it? This is simple...to say. First remember, as David did, that all changes in our lives are only possible as we rely on the "Lord, my Strength (in my weakness) and my Redeemer (that rescued me from the pit where my sins dragged me down.)

Secondly the way to behave ourselves is to find out what are God's guidelines, what boundaries and liberties He has put forth. To 'borrow' a phrase from Jesus mother in John 2, "Whatever He says to you do it." We pray(or hopefully will pray) the old prayer that says "I'll go where you want me to go, I'll say what you want me to say, I will do what you want me to do, I'll be what you want me to be."

It does take a willingness, a devoted willingness to "make good" on our promises such as these. However the opposite is true. What if God doesn't want us to go to a certain place that we feel like needs going to, what if God doesn't want us to say something that we feel like saying (Oh, big temptation here:, what if God doesn't want something done that we think ought to be done? The bottom line is that He wants us to be obedient; that He does want us to be conformed to the image of Jesus, the great example and pattern for us.

What we are talking about is plain (where it is evident to all) Christian living. It's about serving Him in all that we do. It's about putting into action that which we know is right(and the only way that we can know it is right is through the revealed Word of God and power of the Holy Spirit making it possible to be loved). It is showing to the world, to other

It is showing to the world, to other Christians and to God that we really have what we say we have! The proof or the measure of our relationship is how well we do live for Him.

I ran across this verse years ago (or rather it ran over me). Paul has written down in I Timothy 3:15 instructions from God about the correct way to do things on different issues and the purpose being, "that thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God,..." Did you catch that? Divine inspired writing revealing how people of God ought to be and even says where this is to happen—In The House of God. This has to be more than just talking about how we are to act in the church building (although) I have seen some things that are... well, we'll leave that for now.) After all, interestingly, this word house is the same word as in Hebrews 3:6 where it says that Christ ifs faithful "over His own house, whose house are we." The Church, the called out assembly isn't, of course a building. It is the people that are His; those that profess to be Christians are to be the material with which God has to work.

So the urging is for us to know how to be! Believe me, I am not trying to dictate to you how I think it ought to be (I'll let the Word do that). I am not saying that by doing good things on the outside we will win or earn the approval of God. I am saying that I know from what the Bible says that actions and words are supposed to be reflective of what's in the heart. So if the heart isn't clean and we try to put on what isn't inside, we may fool some of the people but God will not be mocked (I've read that!).

I only want to challenge our thinking and urge us to consider our ways (a phrase from Haggai). Maybe it's time for self examination and we might see some areas of our life that may need to be cleaned up. The conviction is from Him but the choice is ours. Am I, Are we a dirty house?


