# Trains, dogs and contractors



June 3, 2021 was a momentous day for Sunset Home and the Concordia community. Over forty people gathered on the front lawn and balconies to watch the unveiling of the latest Orphan Train statue.

The statue is the 33rd placed in and around the Concordia area and was sponsored by the Marilyn and Dean Johnston family, in memory of Dean Johnston. It features a boy with his arm around his dog and honors the

William James Family who were placed out by the Children's Aid Society (CAS) in 1879. Museum curator, Shaley George, and eldest son of Marilyn and Dean Johnston, Bruce Johnston, spoke to commemorate the event.



Perhaps not as well known as the orphan trains, the CAS sponsored a family emigration program from 1874 to 1926. The purpose was to keep families together and provide new opportunities for them out west. William James, his wife, and their four children, along with five other families rode a train to Fort Scott, Kansas and met with success. William became a contractor and later in life ran a boarding house in Cheyenne, Wyoming. More about the emigration program and the William James family can be found in the insert.



Many family members and friends were present for the ceremony. An active member of the community, Dean Johnston was a builder like the emigrant families that rode the train in 1879. Dean also served on the board of Sunset Home

for twelve years. Marilyn was beaming with pride during the event and recalled that in his childhood photos Dean "always had his arm around a dog", another lasting reminder represented in the commemorative statue.


