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Self-centeredness/Pride - Part 2 By Wade Anderson

Have you ever noticed that self-centered or prideful people are easily offended? They easily find ways of getting upset over the simplest and silliest things. In a flash they're totally consumed with self and often times on a fast track towards depression, discouragement or defeat. I'll be totally transparent; there were more than a few times in my life when I would be in at least one of those three states of mind. When someone hurts us, generally the first thing that happens is our flesh wants to magnify the pain and turn all the focus on 'self'. I can see today that I had set certain expectations either on people or circumstances and as soon as I detected it was about to get sideways I'd begin to manipulate the situation by throwing things and yelling. Truthfully, I had a way bigger attitude than I ever was in stature. I couldn't see it then but, if I would have taken a step back and been a bit more objective asking myself, "How much of this did I create?" or "Why have I allowed this situation to happen AGAIN?" as I was sliding into one of those personal crises I could have saved myself a lot of jagged teeth, pain and grief. With fewer of those emotional reactions/decisions I'm beginning to see today that if I ask myself some of these questions, as my feathers are getting ruffled, the crisis's have gotten less and less.

Paul tells us, in Romans 6:6-8 (Amplified), "We know that our old (un-renewed) self was nailed to the cross with Him in order that (our) body (which is the instrument) of sin might be made ineffective and inactive for evil, that we might no longer be slaves to sin. For when a man dies, he is freed (loosed, delivered) from (the power of) sin (among men). Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him." Second Timothy 2:11 tells us the very same thing, "If we have died with Him, we shall also live with Him." So what is Paul saying? In the very second that we have received Jesus as our personal Lord and Savior we have died to that old sin nature. At that point we ALREADY HAVE a NEW righteous nature that is of incorruptible Seed. Listen here to what 1 Peter 1:23 (KJV) says, "Being born again, NOT of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the Word of God, which liveth and abideth forever." You do remember that John told us in John 1:1, "In the beginning was the Word (Jesus), and the Word (Jesus) was with God, and the Word (Jesus) was God" don't you? So this means that our new righteous nature has come through the incorruptible Seed of Jesus, God's Word. I bet many of you are saying to yourselves right now, "I clearly see what it says! So why then am I having such a hard time reflecting this in my own walk?" What many of us fail to understand is this. We HAVE a brand new spirit!! BUT that new spirit still lives in the same ole body, is use to listening to the same ole mind, will and emotions along with our natural senses like sight, taste, smell and touch that have told us what to do and how to react for so many years. We have traveled our lives to this point listening to the old sin nature. So what does the Bible say we are to do to overcome these things? Paul tells us in Romans 12:2 (NLT), "Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you in to a new person by CHANGING THE WAY YOU THINK. Then you will know what God wants you to do, and you will know how good and pleasing and perfect His will really is." We have a very important part in this new adventure we are on with Jesus. We have to read the Word of God in order to uproot the old "sin nature" thoughts. I am NOT saying this in a legalistic way "YOU HAVE TO!" in order to have God love you. NO! But I am saying 'YOU HAVE TOO!' if we ever expect to be transformed to "know how good and pleasing and perfect His will really is."

So then, with Christ now living in us, why are we hurt so easily when someone says or does something to us? Why do we have so many issues in our relationships? Let's see what *Proverbs* 13:11 (Amplified) tells us, "By pride and insolence comes only contention, but with the well-advised is skillful and godly wisdom." When I looked up the word insolence/insolent in the dictionary I found; a quality of being rudely disrespectful. Then I looked up contention; a struggle, debate, controversy, an opinion maintained in discussion. Look back at that Scripture again. Notice there is a 'but' in the middle, with a different outcome on both sides. The Word doesn't leave us much room to sidestep OUR responsibility. The 'but' indicates WE have a choice.

Forgiveness or un-forgiveness carries a deep root of pride in them as well. When someone hurts us regardless if it's mentally or physically it is not wrong that we would not want to put ourselves in that situation again. It's sad, but most of the time when we leave these situations we carry all of the mental baggage right along with us. Then we continue to rehash it over and over and over with anyone who will listen until it consumes our every thought. Those thoughts and conversations like, "I can't believe what they have done to me! After all that I have done for them and they treat me like this!" It doesn't take long with thoughts like these rolling through our heads, like a bad movie, and before we are even fully aware it reaches our hearts and turns to poison. I've heard it said many times that refusing to forgive is like drinking poison and expecting the other person to die. In *Matthew 18:21* Peter asked Jesus, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" In the very next verse, *Matthew 18:22*, Jesus answered, "I can't believe we could very quickly begin to harbor vengeance or revenge for that person. By now many of us know that nothing good ever comes out of these kinds of emotions. Regardless of what we think we know there will still be times we fall into these traps. Listen to these foundational Scriptures by Jesus on this very topic in *Matthew 6:14-15*, which once again come with a choice, "Far If your fargive other perspite with a geninest your,

your beevenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do NOT forgive others their sins, your Father will NOT forgive your sins."

If that's not enough drop down a few paragraphs to **Matthew 7:1-2** where Jesus is teaching about judging others. "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For the same way you judge others, you WILL be judged, and the measure you use, it will be measured to you." I can hear someone already. "What does that have to do with me? I'm not judging them I'm just calling it the way that it is!" Oh really? It sounds to me like Jesus is saying, 'Why are you looking at this person like that? All you are doing is counting, harboring and keeping track of all the things you think they have done to 'you'. Obviously you have forgotten the many times that you have done similar things to numerous other people. Not that I'm keeping track but if you choose to keep track I guess it's only right that I measure you with the same yard stick you are measuring them with, right? And I'm not saying that what they have done is right either. But I don't want you to carry this heavy load. All I am asking you to do is let other peoples wrongs be between them and Me NOT between you and them.' (My paraphrase)

Brothers and sisters we have got to understand that we will NEVER get out of those deep ruts while carrying such heavy loads. Let me use this analogy in hopes of painting a clearer picture. I'm pretty sure that most of us have been on some old country back roads before where the tire tracks have, over the years, caused deep ruts in the ground. When the road is dry it's really not that hard to maneuver the vehicle. But, with just a little bit of rain and no matter how hard we try it becomes a real chore to stay up on the high ground let alone keep moving forward. Those old country back roads are a metaphor for our lives. Even though we are now walking with Jesus there are still 'ruts' of un-forgiveness and various other things that the enemy will continue to try and use against us. In essence it's like he is pouring water on those old thoughts/ruts trying to get us to slide right back into our old ways again. The more we refuse to be tricked by his lies and instead reach up allowing the Son to shine on our paths and in just a short time we will be back up on the high ground moving right along. "How are we going to accomplish this", you ask?

"Get rid of all bitterness, rage, anger, harsh words and slander, as well as all malicious behavior. Instead, be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you ... Live a life filled with love for others, following the example of Christ, who loved you and gave Himself as a sacrifice to take away your sins." (Ephesians 4:31-32, 5:2) I don't see where there is any room for self-centeredness or pride in those Scriptures. Our example of 'how to' walk this life's journey was Jesus. And if He has told us we should and can walk the same way, well, He would never tell us we could do something if He had not already done it to show us the way. In fact Jesus said in John 14:6a, "I am the way, and the truth and the IIIL." In other words, follow My example. In Luke 23:34 Jesus was placed on the Cross and as He was being crucified He looked towards the heavens to His Father and said, "Fathar, forgitre tham, for they do not know what they are doing." You may be saying, "Well that was Jesus. I'm an ordinary man or woman and it is harder for me." I believe that God knew some people would reason like this and have doubt so He put an example in the Bible besides Himself for us to read about. So if that is what you believe let's take a look over to Acts 7:51 and you can read where Stephen had just tore in to the Sanhedrin telling them, "You stiff necked people! Your hearts and ears are still uncircumcised. You are just like your ancestors." Oh boy, they didn't like that! In fact they drug Stephen out of the city and began to stone him (Acts 7:57). As this was happening, Stephen, an ordinary human being like all of us, prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." And as he fell to his knees he cried out, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." (Acts 7:59, 60) Evidently Stephen, an ordinary human being like every one of us, followed Jesus' example. So obviously we can follow not only Jesus' example but Stephens as well and choose to forgive.

Probably everyone of us have been in 'Aisle 2' at the store when 'all of a sudden' we've heard a loud commotion going on in 'Aisle 9'. Actually that 'all of a sudden' just doesn't happen 'all of a sudden' or 'out of the blue' or 'left field'. These situations occur because these kids have not been taught that self-centeredness or acting out is NOT acceptable. These are learned behaviors. Meaning, by not intentionally teaching or training our children the right way we have slacked in our responsibilities as parents and instead we have still taught them. But what we have taught them is how to manipulate and escalate the situation until, he or she get their way. *Proverbs 22:6* (KJV) tells us, *"Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it."* In *Proverbs 13:24* (NIV), *"Whoever spares the rod hates their children, but the one who loves their children is careful to discipline"* leaves no room for 'well maybe'. The Scriptures clearly tell us that if we don't want our children to follow the ways of the world we are responsible to discipline them. The Bible does NOT tell us to beat them in our anger but to discipline them in/with love. God doesn't beat us nor is He angry with us when we fail to listen and be obedient. 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Foot's Wible Study Rotes

1 Chronicles 4:5-6:81

Jabez prayed specifically to be protected from trouble and pain. We live in a fallen world filled with sin, and it is important to ask God to keep us safe from the unavoidable evil that comes our way. But we must also avoid evil motives, desires, and actions that begin with us. Therefore, not only must we seek God's protection from evil, but we must also ask God to guard our thoughts and actions. We can begin to utilize His protection by filling our mind with positive thoughts and attitudes. (4:10)

Rueben's sin of incest was recorded for all future generations to read. The purpose of this was not to smear Reuben's name, but to show that painful memories aren't the only results of sin. The real consequences of sin are ruined lives. As the oldest son, Reuben, was the rightful heir to both a double portion of his father's estate and the leadership of Abraham's descendants, who had grown into a large tribe. But his sin stripped away his right and privileges and destroyed his family. Before you give in to temptation, take a close look at the disastrous consequences sin may provide in your life and the life of others. (5:1) If you try to measure up to society's standards for fame and success, you may neglect your true purpose to please and obey God. In the end, God alone examines our hearts and determines our final standing. (5:24-25)

We should not try to obey God selectively, choosing the commands we will obey and those we will ignore. God's word has authority over every aspect of our lives, not just selected areas. (6:49)

Acts 25:1-26:32

Paul was in prison, but that didn't stop him from making the most of his situation. Military officers and prominent city leaders met in the auditorium with Agrippa to hear his case. Paul saw this new audience as yet another opportunity to present the Good News. Rather than complain about your present situation, look for ways to use every opportunity to serve God and share Him with others. Your problems may be opportunities in disguise. (25:23)

Paul was risking his life for a message that was offensive to the Jews and unbelievable to the Gentiles. Jesus received the same response to His message. (Mark 3:21, John 10:20) To a worldly, materialistic mind, it seems insane to risk so much to gain what seems to be so little. But as you follow Christ, you soon discover that one's most prized possessions cannot compare to even the smallest eternal reward. (26:24)

Psalm 5:1-6:10

The secret to a close relationship with God is to pray to Him earnestly each morning. In the morning, our minds are freer from problems, and then we can commit the whole day to God. Regular communication helps any friendship and is certainly necessary for a strong relationship with God. We need to communicate with Him daily. Do you have a regular time to pray and read God's Word? (5:1-3)

God in His kindness forgives us instead of giving us what we deserve. (6:6)

Proverbs 18:19-21

This Proverb lets us know that it's much harder to win back the friendship of someone you have offended than to capture a city. This goes back to us needing to pay attention to what we say and do. Friends, especially good friends are pretty hard to come by so let's not treat them as if they were disposable. (18:19)

Stomach ... mouth, inner satisfaction comes from true and good speech. Death and life ... the words people say wield great power. (James 3:2) (18:20-21)

parent my mom took all five of us boys with her when she went 'Friday night' food shopping. Our youngest brother was in training as the other four of us yoked up to push shopping carts. If you close your eyes for a moment I'm sure you can picture this 'caravan of four shopping carts, five young boys and a mom strolling through the Kroger's store on a crowded Friday night'. I can guarantee you that the picture you are seeing is NOT the same picture as the one in 'Aisle 9'. Every time we went food shopping my mom would pull into the parking lot, shut off the car and begin to explain to us the RULES we were going to follow while we were in the store. Up to that point we all might have just been bouncing off the ceiling (there weren't seat belts then) of the car. But as soon as the car was shut off we ALL sat at attention as mom said, "Listen to me, when we get in this store I don't want any of you to ask for anything or take anything off the shelves. And IF you decide to act up I'm going to pinch a hunk out of the underneath of your arm. And IF I have to do that you BETTER NOT EVEN MAKE A SOUND!" Like I said above, our Friday night caravan excursions tallied up four heaping carts pushed the whole time by us four older boys, single file and could sometimes last as long as 2 hour ... and generally without incident. We knew that if there was something any of us wanted at the store it was discussed prior to us getting there. We already knew the drill and there were NEVER any questions about 'why' or 'why not' we couldn't have something. I can assure you all that there was NEVER an 'Aisle 9' incident from Frances Anderson's Brats!

Many of the younger people today may read this and say, "That's child abuse!" Believe me it was not child abuse. We were simply taught to respect our parents AND any other grownups in our lives. We didn't talk back to our elders, roll our eyes if we didn't like something and always answered 'yes sir/mam' or 'no sir/mam'. In fact I'm pretty sure that rolling your eyes was never even a 'thing' or invented (for guys anyhow) until the 1980's. If any of our friends' moms or dads seen us acting up somewhere and mom wasn't around they'd step in and give us a verbal tune up. And that was okay. We tried not to get caught in too many of those situations because that was still "making her look like a fool in public" and we'd get what we had coming if she found out. Once again none of this was a cowering type of fear, it was respect. We knew that when mom said something she meant it. I'm in no way saying that our mother was a bad mom. No! Mom was a woman of her word and 'both sides of the but' we learned to respect her word as truth. It was not a dictatorship, we did have a choice. When we, as parents allow an 'Aisle 9' tantrum to become full blown we have just reinforced that child's behavior. He/she has just learned that 'self' can get anything if 'self' is willing to act out/up. This as well has something to say about my mom's character or self-centeredness. A self-centered parent will give in to the child in 'Aisle 9' rolling in the floor and screaming, "I WANT THIS or THAT!" Today I thank my mother for that selfless discipline.

Our flesh, even at the expense of others, considers self-preservation as a virtue worthy of respect. The word 'virtue' means; a quality that we hold to be of great value. In other words, this is someone that thinks of him/her 'self' before or above anyone else. However, this is not the case in God's kingdom. From a military standpoint the beachhead is the most important ground to have and keep hold of in a battle. I'm sure you all have seen plenty of war movies. The Country that has possession of the beachhead has already dug themselves in the ground, built defensive walls and is armed with heavy artillery. They are prepared to defend and hold on to their Country at any and all cost. So what does this have to do with the message? As God's redeemed children, 'self' opens the door and provides an inviting beachhead for the devil's invasion plans. In fact it's his most preferred landing zone! When we become consumed with 'me, me, me, I, I, I, mine, mine, mine' the devil sees that we have singled our own selves out causing us to quickly become a target in his sights. This is why it is so important that we work daily to derail the 'selfishness' in our lives! Why? Because if we fail to do so we are setting ourselves up for some intense spiritual warfare without even being aware of our enemy. It is equally important that we don't separate ourselves from the flock of believers, our church family. First Peter 5:8 warns us of these enemy attacks. "Be careful! Watch out for attacks from the devil, your great enemy. He prowls around LIKE a roaring lion. looking for some victim to devour." First notice it does NOT say that the devil IS a roaring lion. NO! It says he ACTS like one. Secondly notice that the devil is looking for a 'victim'. Isn't that what 'self-centered' people usually think, 'I'm the victim'? Peter goes on to assure us to, "Take a firm stand against him (devil), and be STRONG IN YOUR FAITH. Remember that your Christian brothers and sisters all over the world are going through the same kind of suffering." (Peter 5:9) So YES, there is such a thing as spiritual warfare and we ARE in a war zone where we do have a real enemy.

In Ephesians 6:10-18, Paul not only explains the type of battle we are in, but also our enemies. "Finally, be strong with the Lord's power. Put on ALL God's armor so that you will be able to stand firm AGAINST ALL STRATEGIES AND TRICKS of the devil." Why? "For we are not fighting against people made of flesh and blood, but against the evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against those mighty powers of darkness who rule this world, and against wicked spirit's in the heavenly realm." (Ephesians 6:10-12) Paul has just shown us the opposition we are up against. We all know it is a lot easier to fight an enemy/opponent that we can see, something or someone we can get our hands on. But this is NOT the case here. This is NEVER a battle we'll ever win under the power of self! And PLEASE believe me as I tell you all, "This is NOT a one-time event of surrendering self. NO! It's an on ongoing process throughout our lifetime." When we first recognize 'self' trying to slip back into our lives we MUST immediately rectify the situation through repentance, giving it the boot from our lives! If we continue to walk arm and arm with 'self' it's only a short path

until we fall into a pool of pride, one of self's best friends.

Now that Paul has unveiled our enemy he now pulls back the tarp to reveal the arsenal of weapons God has provided for this warfare. Notice that God has provided the weapons. We, by faith, have to pick them up and use them. "Use every piece of God's armor to resist the enemy in the time of evil, so that after the battle YOU WILL still be STANDING FIRM. STAND YOUR GROUND, putting on the sturdy belt of truth and the body armor of God's righteousness. For shoes, put on the peace that comes from the Good News, so that you will be fully prepared. In EVERY battle you WILL NEED FAITH as your shield to stop the fiery arrows aimed at you by satan. Put on salvation as your helmet, and take the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God." (Ephesians 6:13-17) You might think and even believe, 'that's a pretty powerful arsenal'. And you're right, it is. But listen as Paul gives us the greatest power of it all, "PRAYAT ALL TIMES and on every occasion IN THE POWER of the HOLY SPIRIT." (Ephesians 6:18a) Paul has just informed us of yet another weapon. By praying in the Spirit, which is the heavenly language available to us that our enemy CANNOT understand nor block, we are able to unleash POWER. Jesus told us, in John 4:24, "God is Spirit, and His worshippers must worship IN the Splitt and in truth." In Genesis 1:26 God said, "Let US make mankind in OUR image, in OUR likeness ..." This doesn't mean that we are gods but that we were created in His spirit likeness. That's why we are able to communicate with God where NOTHING else He created is able to do so. Surrendering and allowing the Holy Spirit to speak eliminates 'self' and connects us in a more powerful way. In Ephesians 6:18b Paul calls us to be selfless as he continues with, "Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers for ALL Christians EVERYWHERE." In the military everyone looks out for each other and you are in God's army!

Family, we serve an all knowing, all powerful God that is NEVER caught off guard by ANYTHING that comes our way! He anticipated EVERYTHING we would ever need or go through in our lives AND He provided the Way, the Truth and the Life (*John 14:6*) necessary for us to get through it in victory. Remember, these are defensive weapons. We must use them! We are Not fighting to get something; we are defending what we already have! NO war is won sitting on your butt! And for all of you who have chosen to accept this mission you ARE Overcomers in Christ, through Christ and for Christ!! So leave 'self' behind and go share the Good News (NOT RELIGION) with those around you, teaching them, guiding them and discipling them to follow God!

A Call to Action

Hello brothers and sisters. I hope and pray that every one of you is blessed in life, and filled with God's grace. I sure feel as I am so I have faith you all are as well. I have so much I want to say here today so I will try to edit my daily notes and get to the point.

I gave my life to Christ for the first time in February of 2011. Shortly after in that same year, I fell victim to a heroin addiction, ended up back in jail by 2012 and soon found myself back on a prison yard. At this point, I now have 3 years left to serve on that 8 year sentence. Since I've returned to prison I have learned that prison is not what it once was. There is no unity amongst the convicts, everyone is out for themselves and the broken judicial system is failing our youth and society.

I'd already done 9 1/2 years before I was last released and came back with this 8 piece. I was only out less than 2 years. In that short amount of time from prison, this whole place had changed for the worse. When I look around me here today all I see are young faces from 18 to 25 years old. And 95% of these young men and women coming in to prison are addicted to heroin, meth or other illicit narcotics (mostly heroin). There is such an epidemic of drug use amongst the youth out there and it's leading them to jails, prisons and even death. When I look at all of this I see it as a spiritual holocaust. I believe there is a way to help extinguish a lot of this. It's time not just for the Christians, but also for the people who have battled and beat these same demons themselves to reach out and help lift some of these youngsters up. If we look around it's not hard to see that a whole younger generation of youth is being lost to drug abuse and crimes connected to drugs resulting in prison. As this continues where does that leave the future of our nation? We can all begin to come together, from right behind these walls and fences, RIGHT NOW, because tomorrow is too late, so let's help make a difference! We CANNOT allow the deceptive serpent (satan) to continue to trick our youth any longer.

I rededicated my life to God in February 2016, and since then I have been feeling a strong calling from our Lord to help keep these youth off drugs, off the streets and out of prison. These youth are our future doctors, lawyers, presidents and world leaders. God has also been putting great ideas in my head and heart to help these youth once I'm out. Until then I'll get to work in here, right where I'm at and I challenge all of you other men and women on these prison yards to join me! Take action and pull some of these youngsters up! Let's join together and do some good work for the Lord.

It's not hard to see that the Lord has saved my own life on more than one occasion. If I/we can keep one youngster off of drugs or out of prison, then all the struggles I've been through make it all worth it. Let's stand together, united in Christ and take this dragon down! The angel Michael did it and so can we!
