ADOPTION REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS FOR WINONA HERD

By signing these Adoption Requirements and Regulations and the Adoption Application, the Adopter acknowledges that failure to comply with any of the requirements and regulations will be considered a breach of the Adoption Contract, in which case The Pegasus Project, Inc. shall be entitled to repossess the horse and/or seek damages as set forth herein. These Adoption Requirements and Regulations are incorporated into and are considered part of the Adoption Contract.

Adopted horses must be well treated, sheltered, fed, and cared for. The horse must be provided appropriate and nutritious amounts of food (subject to approval of a veterinarian, if necessary), fresh water, adequate shelter, and kind treatment at all times.

If the horse is stabled or boarded other than on Adopter's home premises, it is the Adopter's responsibility to ensure that the horse receives this same level of good care.

Adopter will not place the horse with an abusive trainer, nor ask of the horse more than he is suited to, given his age, conformation, and health.

Adopter will not allow the horse to run at large and will provide adequate and appropriate fencing.

Adopter must be in a position to provide prompt medical care and treatment if the horse becomes ill, injured, or lame.

Adopter will provide such hoof care as is necessary to keep the horse sound and comfortable.

Adopter is responsible for all expenses incurred in caring for the horse from the time that the horse is adopted.

Adopter certifies that he/she has no prior violations of adoption contracts or convictions for inhumane treatment of animals.

The Pegasus Project, Inc. reserves the right to refuse adoption of any horse to any person.

Adopter agrees to allow The Pegasus Project, Inc. to monitor the well being of the horse for six months. The Pegasus Project, Inc. may conduct a site inspection where the horse is located without prior notification. If it is found that the horse is not cared for properly, The Pegasus Project, Inc. will be entitled to repossess the horse at the Adopter's expense.

The Pegasus Project, Inc. will take legal action to recover all costs, including transport costs and attorney's fees, if such action becomes necessary.

If, in the opinion of a licensed veterinarian, the horse is suffering, whether from disease, injury, or old age, without reasonable expectation of returning to a life of good quality, Adopter will agree to euthanasia.

Under NO circumstances may the horse (or its offspring) be sold at auction or in any other way be put at risk of going to slaughter. Adopter agrees that he/she is committed to the long-term safety and welfare of the horse (and its offspring). Such violation of these Requirements and Regulations is understood and acknowledged to be a material breach of the contract between Adopter and The Pegasus Project, Inc., and the parties agree that the Adopter shall be responsible to pay, as liquidated damages, all funds The Pegasus Project, Inc. had invested in Winona Herd prior to Adopter taking possession of the horse.

Adopter hereby certifies that he/she has read, understands, and agrees to the above terms and conditions for the adoption of a horse from The Pegasus Project, Inc.
