PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES

The October meeting every year offers the opportunity to discuss the current Bylaws and Rules of the Club

The following changes prompted discussion and will be voted on at the November Meeting. If you are not familiar with the Freshwater rules, please refer to the Club website for the full list.

1. It was proposed that the following rule be added to the Freshwater Whopper Board Rules:

Any fish caught in a lake, that is a closed to the public, <u>"MEMBERSHIP ONLY LAKE"</u> will not be eligible for the Whopper Board, or Angler of the Year Awards.

2. The second proposal was regarding the current rule: Trout at PAY to fish lakes10 points per pound.

The Proposed change: Any fish at Pay to Fish lakes the points will be 1/2 the points for that category.

No Salmon? By William and Denise Davis

William & I headed north September 13 for our annual trip to Emeryville for salmon fishing. This was 2 weeks earlier in the season than when we went last year. I had warned him that the salmon numbers had dropped a lot this past month according to the fishing reports. Reservations for this trip had been made back in March so we never know exactly what we're going for on this trip. William gears up for everything so we don't travel light. We always check in with the Landing when we arrive, Emeryville Sport fishing, right after we check in to the Hilton on the corner. Convenience. The landing sold him some salmon set ups but I was surprised he got them. We grabbed our lunch for the next day from Subway & settled in at the hotel. The plan was to get to the boat at 5 a.m. to get our spots at the rail.

Day 1 we were on the New Huck Finn. The skies were clear which meant a lot of wind. They told us to gear up for rockfish and I was hoping we didn't have to do the 2 hr. ride to the Farallons. Captain Jay headed up the coast instead, a 2 hr. ride anyway. We were instructed to send the shrimp flies down w/o bait so we did. While we got some results, it was slow fishing and he moved a lot. By noon we still didn't have limits so we were told to use bait at that point. He proceeded to move back over the spots we had already fished & the results were poor. The only people near us doing any good were 2 locals on rental gear who just kept hauling the fish up. They also kept getting stuck on the bottom. William & I quit fishing the last 2 stops as they just weren't bringing anything up. One ling was brought up, of course by one of the locals on the rental gear.

On the way in we heard that the other boat we go out on, the New Salmon Queen had to turn back due to the conditions on the ocean. That trip had left at 2a.m. for a 60 mile trip to the albacore. I read on Facebook that the Captain's plan was to talk Dan Hernandez into going for albacore the next day. When we boarded the New Salmon Queen Sunday morning the deck hand told us we were going for albacore. We told him we would wait & see as Dan had already told us he wasn't doing that. After some discussion Dan took a vote & it was decided this would be a rockfish/ling trip. Some guys hadn't brought gear for albacore and some just didn't feel up to it. We headed out to the Farallons as the ocean had lain down quite a bit since the day before. As we passed the Farallons I assumed Captain Shim was taking us to his super ling spot. We stopped to fish & as he was maneuvering the boat he suddenly took off, not telling us anything. About a half hour later we were told to dump the rockfish setups and get ready for Albacore. So we were taken hostage on the Captain's boat in order to fish for albacore that day. In the middle of all this one gentleman snags himself in the palm of his hand with a hook & it was decided he couldn't fish. An EMT on board wrapped it up and told him to sit this one out.

We moved on again until the captain started hollering about the fish boiling around the boat. I decided to sit this one out awhile until I knew what exactly I was going to be doing. Within a minute or 2 we had alibies on the deck all around. William had a quick hook up and landed his easily. His new rod was great. As things slowed down we were told to stop fishing if we had gotten 1 and let the others get 1 fish apiece. The guys were complaining about the bait but the fish didn't. With my husband at my side coaching and keeping my gear on the boat I was able to land my first albie. They ranged from 25 to 30 lbs. We took 25 with 22 fishing.

Jerry with the hook in his hand was one of those who didn't want to fish the albacore. I had noticed he was the first on the deck when we stopped. After most of us had landed our fish he was still on the deck, a guy on each side of him while he hooked and landed his albie.

We headed back to the Farallons for the rockfish and got limits easily, no bait required. A couple of more lings boarded also. Once again Jerry was on deck fishing, hook still in his hand. It took him until 10PM that night to get that hook out at an Urgent Care, but I think he went to dinner first anyway. There were 9 of us from southern California on the boat, and he was one of us. Once again we enjoyed our Northern California fishing trip even without the salmon this time.
