Welcome Roy!

Roy is a recent addition to our recovery team at RecoveryWerks!. He works part-time with the teens leading their meetings, having appointments, going to coffee and sober activities. Here is his story:

My name is Roy Reina and my sobriety date is May 9, 2015. I was born in San Antonio, Texas in 1984 and I got sober when I was 30. The first time I tried drugs was 9. My addiction really took off when I turned 18. Up to that point using drugs was something I did to fit in and have fun.



From 18 to 30 I was using pills, heroin, meth, and anything else I could get my hands on. Using drugs became a way of surviving my days. I was in and out of jail and constantly fighting with my family. I wasn't able to maintain a job, hold down a relationship, and every vehicle I ever had I wrecked.

One day I showed up to the Palmer Drug Abuse Program, PDAP, and asked how I could stop using drugs. They told me to go to meetings, get a sponsor, and come to activities. I didn't believe them but I decided to try it anyway. After a year of coming to the group I got arrested after a meeting and decided that it was time for me to do something different. I went to treatment for six months. When I left treatment I moved into a sober living home where I lived for two years and made lifelong friends. Recovery showed me how to love myself which is why I was using drugs to begin with. I never really loved the person I was. Recovery gave me many blessings including a beautiful wife, my family's trust, a house, a truck and so many friends who I consider family. Recovery has taught me that if I look for the positive then every situation in my life becomes surrounded in positivity. The life I live today is beyond anything I could have expected from making the best decision ever. Living in Recovery!!

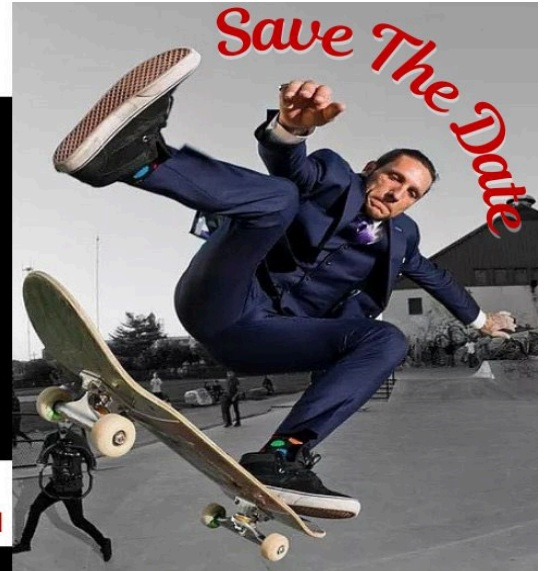
