Motion by C. Smock, second by Lueck to approve agenda. Ayes: all, carried. Motion by Wolfe, second by Lueck to approve consent agenda: 06/16/2025 minutes, June 2025 claims, June treasurer’s report, Building permits #1421-privacy fence at 317 3rd Ave (Fresinger) #1422 -209 addition to building at 1st St N. (Krapfl). Ayes: all, carried. Wyatt Lueck asked about possible projects in the City he could perform volunteer hours to achieve his scouting award. Pike presented water/sewer reports and valve gate replacement project at sewer plant is complete. Alarm sounded at sewer plant when we had 5” of rain, Daniel and Tim were able to pull a pump and remove a piece of meatal stuck in pump, recommends we have someone inspect and service the pumps. Motion by Gansen second by Wolfe to sign contract with Electric Pump to inspect them. All Ayes, motion carried. Hosch checking possible road crack sealing, and KIB lighting install project will begin after BTV Concert. Clerk reviewed legal aspect of trading versus selling pickup and dump truck. Waiting for bid on dump truck trade in value. Curb repair of 3rd St NE will begin first with mill and overlay to be done around Sept. Residents will be notified when we find out definite dates. Lueck motioned, second by Wolfe to approve Athletic Assoc license amendment for parish festival. All Ayes, motion carried. Clerk gave update on nuisance properties. Lueck will order metal sign for maintenance garage. Council reviewed upcoming Benefit the Vets Event including parking, security, fencing, restrooms and set up/tear down. Motion by C. Smock second by Wolfe to order two 18.3 CU FT chest freezers and 3 rolls of snow fence for BTV concert. All Ayes motion carried. Special thank you to McDonough Foundation for \$2,000 grant for AED machine at Memorial Hall. City elections are fast approaching on Nov 4, 2025. Candidate filing starts Aug 25th and the last day to file papers with the City Clerk is Sept 18th. Mayor and 3 council seats will be up for election this year. Motion by Lueck, second by C.
