Carolyn (Welniak) Donaldson '79 STILL AN ANCHOR FOR THE COMMUNITY



Carolyn Donaldson has taken on a new role, but continues to be a positive influence

With a strong belief in public media and making connections with the community, Carolyn Donaldson has begun a new phase of her life after serving as a news anchor for WTAJ-TV for more than 20 years.

In November 2017, Donaldson began in the role as community engagement manager at WPSU Penn State, a new position for the public media company. Not only does she bring to the position her skills and resources but also the experience of having served on the advisory board at WPSU for several years.

“I got to see first-hand the unbelievable quality and the content and all of the cool stuff they were turning out in forms of the stories and the different programs they were releasing both nationally and locally,” she says. “[It was] a little bit of an evolution and reinvention for me.”

This new position of community engagement manager at WPSU lets Donaldson explore her love for public media even further than her time spent on the advisory board. Her goals and priorities are to first connect with the community.

“I’m trying to reach out to all of the different levels — business, social, community, government — trying to make contacts and see what are we doing right and what are we doing wrong; here’s what we’re doing, here’s how we connect; what can we work on together,” she says.

She is in the process of making PBS K-12 classroom resources available for local school districts.

“The PBS Ready To Learn Initiative is a huge collection of digital curriculums that are available to educators all across the country, and through us, we have access to be able to arm educators with the latest cutting-edge curriculum guides, and videos,” she says.

For example, students are currently learning by using programs on tablets, and in this digital age, Donaldson wants to connect teachers with the latest technologies from this PBS program so they can be successful in the classroom. She is looking to make connections with educators across the region.

“Some of our school districts around our region are already so digitally connected, and we hope to engage

them as our early promoters in this process,” she says. When asked about her transition from being an anchor on WTAJ-TV to this new role at WPSU, she says, “It was a very hard-wrought decision. I knew I was leaving a great place that tells great stories to go to another great place that promotes our area and tells our region’s stories.”

From being a communications professor at Penn State Altoona to serving as a news anchor for many years to making connections and being involved with the Central PA community, Donaldson has made an impact and touched lives of many in the region.

“I had to reinvent myself a little bit,” she says, “and I’m still learning, but it’s exciting, it’s challenging, and changing up the game plan just adds a new boost of energy to anything that you do in life.”

PATRICIA O’TOOLE AS NEW DIRECTOR OF FINANCE



The Toledo Museum of Art (TMA) announces that Patricia L. O’Toole has been hired to be the Museum’s director of finance. O’Toole began her appointment at TMA Dec. 11, 2017. In this role she will oversee the financial administration of the Museum.

Since 2008, O’Toole has served as the director of operations at Hospice of Northwest Ohio in Perrysburg, Ohio. As a member of the executive team there, she has been responsible for leading the financial, IT, facilities, dietary and general administrative departments and has been a key participant in ongoing strategic planning with the executive team and board of trustees. Her contributions in that role led to substantial reduction in patient care expenses and significant improvement in financial performance.

Prior to her current position, O’Toole was the director of finance at Maumee Valley Country Day School, a preschool through grade 12 independent school in Toledo for 10 years. Among O’Toole’s additional previous experience have been financial and administrative responsibilities on behalf of CBT Credit Services, Cincinnati Bell Telephone and Deloitte and Touche.

O’Toole received her Bachelor of Science in accounting from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, and her MBA from the University of Cincinnati.

Bridgette Woodall ‘89 **THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD NAMES** **A FULL-TIME ARCHIVIST**

HARTFORD, Conn. (Nov. 20, 2017)–The Archdiocese of Hartford has hired Bridgette A. Woodall, as its new archivist.

In her role, Woodall will be responsible for the collection, management and preservation of all materials chronicling the legacy of the Archdiocese of Hartford and its parishes, offices and ministries. She will collect and administer the use of rare books and manuscripts, sacred artwork and objects, and official and historical records; maintain collection databases and inventories; provide leadership in archival policies and procedures; contribute to the history of the Archdiocese and the field of church history through research and publication; represent the Archdiocese at professionally related conferences; and provide research services for individuals.

Woodall’s past experience includes a position as a project archivist at Andover Newton Theological School, Newton Centre, MA, where she prepared archival collections for relocation to the Yale Divinity School and other religious repositories. Prior to that, she served as an archives consultant and project archivist at Worcester State University, Worcester, MA. There, she established the university’s archives and special collections. While at Historic New England, Boston, MA, she processed the papers of historically prominent New England families and coordinated the conversion of paper-based inventories into searchable online finding aids through an NHPRC grant. At Harvard University, Cambridge, MA, she worked as a manuscript cataloger for the Schlesinger Library, appraising, processing, and preparing online finding aids for personal papers and institutional records of notable American women and women’s organizations. In addition, she worked at the Roman Catholic

Archdiocese of Boston, where she oversaw the daily operations of the archives and reading room.

Woodall has several writing credits. In 2015, she published an article entitled, “Seeing the World Through New England’s Eyes.” She was a feature writer for Schlesinger News, and contributed a weekly column to The Pilot, the Catholic newspaper of the Archdiocese of Boston.

In 2005, she received a Master of Science in Library and Information Science with a concentration in Archives Management from Simmons College, Boston, MA. In 1997, she earned a Master of Divinity from the Candler School of Theology, Emory University, Atlanta, GA, and received her Bachelor of Arts Degree from Adrian College, Adrian, MI, where she majored in International Studies and German.

A native of Toledo, OH, Woodall has spent the past fifteen years (along with her one cat, a native of MA) living and working in and around the metro Boston area. She enjoys exploring and engaging New England history and culture with family and friends.


