## HAZZAN'S NOTES

Dear Friends,

This month we complete our High Holyday season with the extended festival of our gladness and joy, *Sukkot and Sh'mini Atzeret/Simchat Torah*. The Torah tell us to celebrate this festival for seven days with an additional eight day of solemn assembly which is *Sh'mini Atzeret/Simchat Torah*.

Normally, we would be putting up our Sukkah right after Yom Kippur and procuring our Lulav and Etrog for the Sukkot service. This year, things are different, as they have been for all our other festival celebrations in 2020. Because Sukkot begins on Shabbat, there is no waving of the Lulav and Etrog as is custom on Shabbat, so you will not see them on our Erev Sukkot broadcast. Also, due to COVID, we are not assembling, and therefore, we will not be putting up our communal Sukkah either. And, because we are not assembling, you will also not see the customary Hakafot (processions) with the Torahs as you would on a normal Sh'mini Atzeret/Simchat Torah. But, we do hope that those who do have a Sukkah will put theirs up this year and maybe host people for al fresco dining as is customary and is also happening with so many restaurants at this point.

We know these are trying times, but we hope to bring you as much light and joy as we possibly can through it all. We hope our broadcasts are an inspiration to you and give you the connections you need and want from us. Remember, *OPT IN!* Our community needs you as much as you need us during these very trying times.

## Our Torah



As you all probably know, Beth Shalom of Whittier owns four Torahs. The most we need for services throughout the year is three. When we ordered a portable Aron Kodesh, we purchased one that would hold three Torahs. A larger one would have been exceedingly difficult to move from place to place on the bimah. We have been storing the 4<sup>th</sup> Torah in Hazzan Lance's office.

The Board discussed what we should do with this 4<sup>th</sup> Torah. It did not seem right to have it sitting idle when there were so many communities in need of one.

We were unanimous in wanting it to go to a community that really needed it and would otherwise not have a Torah. That immediately brought to mind, Kulanu. They are an organization that was established in 1994 and supports isolated, emerging and returning Jewish communities around the world. They have put on presentations at Beth Shalom several times and some of our members have been actively involved with them for years.

I contacted them and they were thrilled. This donation will enable a congregation to have full services on Shabbat, holidays and all Torah-reading days. They will move from using a paper printed Torah or a Chumash to the "real thing".

They quickly got back to us with a synagogue high on their list that had a climate-controlled place for the Torah. The synagogue is in Honduras. It is Communidad Sephardita de Honduras HaChavim. They are a group consisting of anousim (marranos), who are very observant. They are ecstatic to be receiving the Torah and for them this is proof that G-d has blessed their ancestors for keeping the faith in hiding for so many generations. These are people who never would have been able to buy a Torah on their own.

The Torah will be picked up by a member of their congregation and flown back to Honduras with him. They are buying a seat on the airplane for the Torah. Hazzan has dressed the Torah in its white mantle. It is wrapped in tellism and is in a plastic wheeled container. We are keeping the accountrements and they will be displayed in the new display case that we are having built in the lobby of our office suite. We expect this to happen sometime after October 31<sup>st</sup> to give them time to take care of the complications of traveling with COVID restrictions. Kulanu is working with them on the travel arrangements.

Kulanu will arrange for a plaque for the Torah with wording of our choice to say where it came from. Kulanu was very thankful for the donation and said we could rest assured that our Torah will have a second most cherished life.

We on the Board feel that this is most certainly the right thing to do. This Torah will bring years of blessings and happiness to a new community. For the first time, they will have a real Torah to use on Torah reading days. Our beloved Torah will continue to be loved and treasured.
