Seven ways to give back in St. Pete while social distancing

Here are seven ways DHCA can help the community during CareFest 2020 and beyond:
Adopt a Local Nonprofit: Make a donation to a local organization or team up with your neighbors to adopt a nonprofit .

• Donate Supplies: Organize a donation drive for food, masks, school supplies, toiletries, and more. Some options include homeless relief, senior support, pet owners, and children and back to school. You can even donate old computers, tablets and cell phones.

• Neighborhood Cleanup: Dumpsters will be delivered for neighbors to help together and dispose of their collection separately.

• Volunteer and Give Back Virtually: Support St. Pete's youth through a number of volunteering or mentoring programs. More information can be found at pcsb.org/mentor.

• Participate in a virtual 5K for a cause, like the Healthy St. Pete Fit City Virtual 5K on Oct. 4-10.

• Make a donation at a Power of Change Donation Station yellow parking meter stations throughout the city and support homeless services.

• Donate to the Utility Assistance Program: Make one-time or recurring donations through your city of St. Petersburg utility bill.

• Support local businesses: Shop at local retailers and restaurants or offer professional services like accounting, marketing and technology for free to local businesses.
