Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)

Minister Mendicino announced a new pathway to permanent residence for over 90,000 essential workers and international student graduates who are actively contributing to Canada's economy. Starting May 6, 2021, this pathway will allow eligible international graduates, who studied in Canada, as well as temporary workers in health care and other essential occupations, to apply for permanent residence. IRCC will accept applications under these policies from May 6 - November 5 2021, or until a program stream has reached its limit: 20,000 temporary foreign workers in health care, 30,000 temporary foreign workers in selected essential occupations, 40,000 international graduates.

FUN Fact about Canada!

In 1816, Canada didn't have a summer! The country's eastern population was snowmobiling in June and thawing water cisterns in July. Trees shed their leaves and there were reports of migratory birds dropping dead in the streets. Ironically, as eastern Canada stayed cool, the Arctic warmed, creating flotillas of icebergs off the coasts of Nova Scotia and Newfoundland. At the time, it was thought that the icebergs were the cause of the cooling. What was the real reason? In 1815, the Tambora volcano erupted in Indonesia, spewing tonnes of ash and dust into the air. Less sunlight reached the earth and this caused the planet's surface to cool. The volcanic eruption changed the climate in different ways around the world, but Eastern Canadians were treated to the summer that just didn't come. Hopefully that never happens again!

EXPLORE our Community!

Have you ever visited the snake pits north of Pelly, Saskatchewan? If not, now is the time and it's quite the sight to see! With the arrival of warmer temperatures, red-sided garter snakes (which are harmless) begin seeping out of crevices where they've spent the winter hibernating and begin their mating season. Tens of thousands of snakes blanketing the forest undergrowth. A gathering of this many snakes is not a common occurrence and only takes place in a handful of sites in North America.



To see this fascinating marvel of nature, take the grid road north of Pelly for 5 km to the sign for Fort Livingstone. Head west for 2.7 km to the historic marker, then continue another 0.2 km past the marker to a clearing between two bushes. Park here and walk north only a few metres to the riverbank. This sight is short-lived, usually for only a couple weeks or so in early to mid-May. Call the Pelly village office for updates.
