Dr. Robbins is Executive Director, Department of Surgery and Simmons Cancer Institute, Southern Illinois University School of Medicine. These include an extended medical outreach project as a visiting professor in Tanzania, local specialty service with the Space Coast Volunteers in Medicine, and consulting expertise in head and neck surgery and oncology. During his academic career, he published in excess of 300 articles and led national committees and organizations within his field.
