Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What a blessing this has been. I am truly honored to be the Lay Rector of our Lord's Cursillo #187. Our Bishop Mark Lawrence recently reminded us, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few." (Matthew 9:37)

Our verse for the weekend is a reminder that we have been given the Great Commission: to be Fishers of Men. Our task is to testify about the good news of God's grace to those unseen neighbors in unseen neighborhoods. We are all called to be his laborers. People who learn to trust Jesus move from obeying God because obedience feels forced on them, to obeying God because it is in their hearts and minds to desire what God wants. And God wants us to share the Good News.

Our patron Saint for this weekend is Andrew. Andrew and John became the first disciples after having spent the afternoon with Jesus, and the first thing Andrew did was to go home and tell his brother Peter about it, (John 1:41-42). He said, "We have found the Messiah!" He was known for bringing individuals, not crowds to Jesus. He was more concerned with bringing people to Jesus than who got the credit, or who was in charge. Andrew is the very picture of all those who labor quietly in the background. In other words, he was the first "Cha".

I pray that when we pray the words of the Invocation on our Pilgrims guide "Come Holy Spirit. 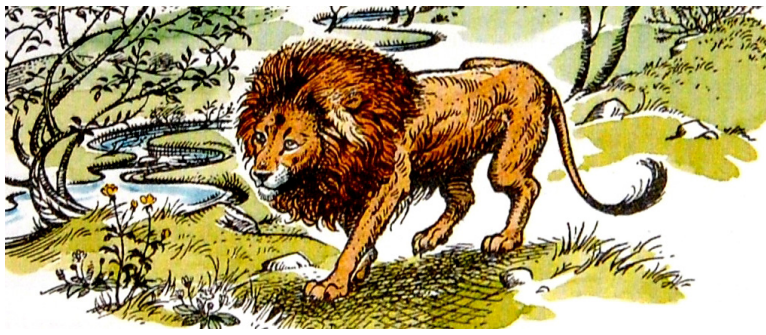

THERE IS NO SAFE INVESTMENT

Lewis compares God's creation of people like our invention of an engine that runs on gasoline. Without it, it wouldn't run correctly. Likewise, "God designed the human machine to run on Himself," he says (*Mere Christianity*). When we break our life off from the lifegiver, we begin to fade (like those in *The Great Divorce*). What God is looking for is the change that comes as Eustace in *The Voyage of the Dawn Treader* scratches more and more deeply and discovers the hardened dragon scales were falling off.

God is aiming for a rebirth. It means we'll encounter the two edges of suffering and hope. But, Lewis reminds us in *The Four Loves*... about the alternative which might appear safe but offers a damning end.

"There is no safe investment. To love at all is to be vulnerable. Love anything, and your heart will certainly be wrung and possibly be broken. If you want to make sure of keeping it intact, you must give your heart to no one, not even to an animal. Wrap it carefully round with hobbies and little luxuries; avoid all entanglements; lock it up safe in the casket or coffin of your selfishness. But in that casket—safe, dark, motionless, airless—it will change. It will not be broken; it will become unbreakable, impenetrable, irredeemable. The alternative to tragedy, or at least to the risk of tragedy, is damnation. The only place outside Heaven where you can be perfectly safe from all the dangers and perturbations of love is Hell.

"I believe that the most lawless and inordinate loves are less contrary to God's will than a self-invited and self-protective lovelessness. It is like hiding the talent in a napkin and for much the same reason. 'I knew thee that thou wert a hard man.' Christ did not teach and suffer that we might become, even in the natural loves, more careful of our own happiness. If a man is not uncalculating towards the earthly beloveds whom he has seen, he is none the more likely to be so towards God whom he has not. We shall draw nearer to God, not by trying to avoid the sufferings inherent in all loves, but by accepting them and offering them to Him; throwing away all defensive armour. If our hearts need to be broken, and if He chooses this as the way in which they should break, so be it."

What are you in love with and how has it shaped you? Is it God or a replacement? If we are to follow Jesus, it is to a sure scene of crucifixion, both his and ours, as we painfully surrender our wills to his, our ways to his, our luxuries to his crown. Let us rekindle again the risk and reward of the Gospel.
