AMOS Civic Academy on Housing

AMOS (A Mid-Iowa Organizing Strategy) is an organization of institutions working together to make our community a place that works for everyone. First Baptist is one of 37 institutional members of AMOS and one of 9 members in Ames. This year our Ames cluster is focusing on housing needs. Civic Academies are being held at our AMOS members this spring – opportunities to learn about housing in our community as well as have conversations and share stories and personal experiences around housing. (This will be much like the House Meetings we have held in the past, along with a teaching/learning component.)

Our church will hold a Housing Civic Academy on Sunday, April 27 during the Church School hour. Our adult classes will not meet on that day and we will instead offer the Civic Academy. FBC Helps Support Immigrant Family

A family from Bolivia arrived in Ames in January. They fled their country for their safety and have been approved to seek asylum in the United States. They are awaiting an asylum hearing. They have been living with a family here in Ames and will be moving to their own home. The family is sponsored by ASIP (Ames Sanctuary Interfaith Partners), a coalition of faith groups that helps support immigrants in our community.

The family includes the mother/wife who is a medical doctor, the husband/father who has experience in business, and their fourth grade son.

We have received thank you notes from ASIP leaders that are posted on the bulletin board. One shared,

Your donation has already made an impact on the family. They are very touched that your congregation has stepped forward to help them create a life for themselves here in Ames. With so much turmoil surrounding changes to immigration policies, it is truly a blessing knowing there are individuals and congregations that are welcoming, caring, and supportive of our immigrant friends.
